On a very warm Saturday afternoon, a large crowd witnessed a seven-goal thriller of a match with the ascendancy swinging one way then the



other until the final minutes of the game. Dunston made a bright start and took a half-time lead with a Dale Pearson penalty but after the re-start, table topping Belper Town came out with all guns blazing and raced into a 3-1 advantage. Just after the hour-mark Luke Carr headed in to reduce the arrears and ten minutes later David Robinson grabbed an equaliser. Just when it looked like the game would end up even, Dale Pearson made a long run into the Belper box and earned a penalty that he fired home to grab all three points.

Since that date, Belper Town have had to recover from a terrible event when their whole Stadium was totally flooded during that severe storm in the Autumn. Lesser Clubs would have folded when suffering such a catastrophic blow but "The Nailers" seem to have thankfully come through that successfully.

We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this afternoon. Referee Sam Parnaby from Bishop Auckland is joined by his Assistant Referees Danny Taylor was originally from Glasgow but is now based in Durham and Patrick Laws from Cramlington.

The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as the Football Section of a Print Works Sports & Social Club. Long-serving Club stalwart John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, formed the team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on a public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics FC. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being League Champions twice and League Cup Winners once – the club felt a

need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the

Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011-2012 when, under the

Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2-0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the "Club Playing Name" must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generaous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved more difficult than expected in the NPL North West Division and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any real consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table.

After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston started the 21-22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division much stronger and finished in sixth-place, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs. Last Season saw yet another upgrade in playing strength and more stadium improvements but the same disappointing final finish of sixth from top.

In a very competitive Division, we will have to go that extra step in the 2023-24 season if we are to achieve our aim of promotion but under the guidance of our new Team Manager Jon McDonald and his Coaches we will do our best!



HARRY BARCLAY (Defender)



His time at St James' Park was hampered by an injury but now, Harry is looking to start over at the UTS Stadium. Still only 19-years-old, Barclay is a one to watch out for and will be looking to gain some valuable experience in the men's game this season.



CRAIG BAXTER (Defender)

Jack was also selected to represent England Universities for a round of friendly fixtures against Wycombe Wanderers and Gateshead in May 2023.










DALE PEARSON (Forward)


MICHAEL PEARSON (Midfielder) Having previously played for Hartlepool United, Blyth Spartans and South Shields, the current Club Captain

During his time at Dunston, Michael has collected a Northern League winners medal, Northern League Cup medal and JR Cleator Cup Winners medal.






JUDE SWAILES (Defender)


He scooped a number of awards at the end of the 2022/23 season following a superb season, including the Fred Foulis Committee Player of the Season award.

Alongside his studies, he completed a three year placements at Park View Academy of Sport and was able to develop his skills as a practitioner.





Dunston FC 2-1 Newton Aycliffe (26/12/23)



Dunston secured a fifth consecutive win in our final home game of 2023 with a 2-1 win against Northern Premier League East newcomers, Newton Aycliffe.

The visitors to an early lead through Cieran Jackson however, a goal from Jack Maskell and a stunning strike from David Robinson turned things around for Dunston.

Jon McDonald utilised his squad as he handed starts to Richard Coulson and Luke Carr, with Michael Pearson slotting in at right back.

Dunston started brightly as Jack Maskell was gifted two early chances in the opening ten minutes. First Dale Pearson swung in a perfect cross to Maskell who had his glancing header held by Fisher.

He then came close again when he drove an effort towards goal which was always rising over the bar.

Despite the pleasing start, the visitors broke the deadlock after just 14 minutes. Cole Kiernan broke forwards and thundered a shot off the crossbar however, the ball fell to Cieran Jackson who lashed the ball home on the rebound.

Dunston appeared to rally after conceding and almost equalised from a corner after 25 minutes. A Phil Turnbull delivery found the head of Maskell who leapt high and guided his header just wide.

Ten minutes later, Maskell was not to be denied again as he pulled Dunston level with a calm finish. David Robinson played an excellent ball over the top of the Newton Aycliffe defence to Maskell, who beat the offside trap, and ran through on goal and slotted past Fisher.

The chances continued to fall for the home side and Dunston probably should have taken the lead on 42 minutes when Dale Pearson had a golden opportunity, but he lashed his powerful effort wide.

With the first half coming to an end, David Robinson scored his third goal in two games with yet another goal of the season contender. Luke Carr played a short pass into Robinson who thundered the ball into the top corner from outside the box.

Into the second half Dunston continued to look threatening against the in-form Newton Aycliffe. There were strong penalty appeals just a few minutes into the half when there were claims for a handball against Newton Aycliffe, but nothing was given.

On 68 minutes, Jack Maskell looked to double his tally for the afternoon when he dispossessed Costello 30-yards out, but the subsequent effort on goal sailed high of the target.

Minutes later, second half substitute Jordan Lamb beat his man down the right, pulled a well-weighted cross into the box for Maskell, but he couldn't convert from close-range.

In the final 15 minutes, the visitors had some chances to pull themselves level. The ball fell to Marc Costello at the back post after a well-worked free kick routine however, Dunston just about managed to get the ball away from danger.

The visitors then won a free kick on the edge of the box. Substitute Wayne Whitfield stepped up, but his effort only hit the wall. It was then Kyle Davis who came close just minutes later as he dragged his shot wide inside the penalty area.

With the clock ticking down in stoppage time, Dunston almost sealed the win. Some tenacious play from Richard Coulson saw him win the ball in the middle of the park. He played the ball through to Sado Djalo, but the left-footed effort from Djalo rolled past the post.

Dunston were able to see the game out and climb up to 4th in the Pitching In Northern Premier League table, still with three games in hand on each of the teams above.

who was appointed in December 2022 following Steve Kittrick's departure from the club. Lee was recruited from Corby Town, where he had led the Steelman to a play-off position but decided on the move to the Raygar Stadium, opting for the challenge of keeping the Nailers in the Premier Division. Before that, Lee managed Loughborough Dynamo as one of the youngest manages in the Northern Premier League and also has managerial experience at Sileby and Ashby Ivanhoe. As a player, he made appearances for Coalville Town, Shepshed Dynamo and Loughborough before he was forced into retirement through a cycling accident.

MATT WAIN (Assistant Manager) Matt was Lee Attenborough's assistant manager and performance coach at Corby Town and continued their partnership with a joint move to the Raygar Stadium. Holding a UEFA B licence, Matt is responsible for planning training sessions, handling and working on performance data, and developing fitness plans for the players.

DAN MOORE (Goalkeeper) Dan returned to the Raygar Stadium for a third spell in December 2023 after previous periods on loan from Burton Albion. He signed his first professional contract with the Brewers in the summer of 2021 having graduated from the Academy. Daniel was spotted by Albion scouts playing for his previous club Bedworth United, where some eye-catching performance persuaded the Brewers to bring him to the club. Had a severe injury that curtailed his last spell at the club, so he will be hoping for better fortunes this time around.

JASON ALEXANDER (Goalkeeper) The 6ft 6 shot stopper joined the Nailers from Basford United in November 2023 where he has reunited with former manager, Lee Attenborough. Jason started his career at Chesterfield and later moved to Boston United, initially with the Under 21s before he stepped up to senior level, making his debut against Solihull Moors. He has been at Clipstone, Worksop Town, Loughborough Dynamo and Corby Town previously, working with the Nailers' manager in the latter two clubs.



JAY RABONE (Goalkeeper) Jay (Jacob) is a tall and athletic goalkeeper who arrived at the Raygar Stadium in July 2023. He spent his formative football career at Nuneaton Borough bat then opted for a scholarship opportunity in the US, signing for California-based team, Lake Tahoe Community College. On his return to the UK, Jay signed for Hellenic League side, Southam United, where his performances for the Warwickshire club drew excellent reviews.

BEN ALGAR (Defender) Ben came through the youth systems of Sheffield United and Chesterfield, making his professional debut for the Spireites in 2007 against Hartlepool United. He made 15 league appearances for Chesterfield but was released in 2009 and then had short periods with Burton Albion and Mansfield Town before joining Matlock Town where he made 29 appearances and scored 3 goals for the Gladiators. Ben moved to the US in 2011, playing for FC New York but moved back to the UK after the club folded in 2012. Since then, Ben has played at Frickley Athletic, AFC Mansfield and Maltby Main and was named in the NPL Division One Team of the Season in 2018/19.

BEN RHODES (Defender) Ben is an attacking right back who joined the club from Worksop Town in summer 2020. His adaptability made him a key addition to the Nailers squad last season, particularly as he is able to play anywhere across the back four. And, with a great attitude, Ben has really made his presence felt at the Raygar Stadium. He has also played at Stocksbridge Park Steels from where he had a dual registration spell with Penistone Church. Ben won the Manager's Player of the Season award in 2022/23.

PHILIP WATT (Defender) Phil joined the Nailers for his latest spell with the club in June 2023. He started his football path with his hometown club of Rotherham United. He moved on to Lincoln City in 2004 and spent four years at Sincil Bank, where he made his first team debut in the opening match of the 2007/8 season and played again in an FA Cup tie against Nottingham Forest. There had been a couple of loan spells at



at Corby Town. After another loan spell at Grantham, the dependable centre back made it a permanent move, but after one- season moved on to Boston United. His next move was to Coalville Town where he scored two goals in his 12 games, before starting a long association with Belper Town. In three different spells he reached the 150-appearance milestone for the Nailers, as well as scoring a winning play-off goal to gain promotion and was twice voted into the team of the division during his stays.

DANNY SOUTH (Defender) Danny originally joined the Nailers during summer 2018 in a bid to reinforce the defence. The big, strong and tall centre half has enjoyed spells at clubs including Sheffield FC, Frickley Athletic, Ossett Town and Ossett Albion, where his combative approach has been a byword for his performances. Danny proved to be a dominant force for the Nailers since joining, leading the club to promotion to the NPL Premier Division in 2022/23. The club was disappointed when he opted for a move to Ossett United in October 2022 but equally delighted when he agreed to re-join the Nailers in June 2023.

DECLAN DUNN (Defender) Nottingham-born Declan joined the youth-team at Notts County at under-10 level. He made his senior debut for the Magpies in November 2018, coming on as a substitute for in a 4-0 defeat at Barnsley in the FA Cup. He signed his first professional contract at Meadow Lane nine days later. After a very brief spell at Dover Athletic, Declan signed for Grantham Town on a month's loan before joining Basford United on a permanent basis in August 2020. He returned to Grantham Town on loan in December 2022 before being recalled by Basford in March 2023. He signed for Belper Town in June 2023.

SIDIK ATCHA (Defender) Sidik is a central defender who can also play in midfield. He signed for the Nailers in November 2023 from Shepshed Dynamo. He previously played under the Nailers manager, Lee Attenborough at Corby Town and at Loughborough Dynamo but has also appeared for Harborough Town, AFC Rushden & Diamonds, St Ives Town, Soham Town Rangers and Daventry Town.



MASON WARREN (Midfield) Born in Doncaster, Mason came through the junior ranks at Rotherham United, signing professional in May 2015 and spent three years with them. He had a number of loan spells during his time at Rotherham, including Sheffield FC, Harrogate Town, Grantham, Matlock, Boston Utd, North Ferriby and Gainsborough Trinity and made one start for the Rotherham first team in the EFL Cup in 2016. He was released at the end of the 2017/18 from where he joined Mickleover. A strong playmaking midfielder, Mason can also play in defence and assist in the attack. He was captain of the Mickleover side that finished top of the aborted NPL two years ago scored four goals last season. He joined the Nailers in June 2023.

CURTIS BURROWS (Midfield) Born in Nottingham, Curtis began his career in the Colts team at Burton Albion before gaining a scholarship with Ilkeston FC. He graduated from the Robins' Under-21s and reserves to make his first team debut against Whitby Town in April 2013. In December 2015 Curtis began a loan spell at Grantham before leaving Ilkeston permanently to join Coalville Town. He then moved to Loughborough Dynamo in March 2019 and scored 28 goals in 83 appearances for them before arriving at Corby Town in July 2022. He subsequently followed manager Lee Attenborough to the Raygar Stadium in February 2023.

JAMES CADMAN (Midfield) Vastly experienced in the highest levels of non-league despite being only 27 years of age, James has continued his footballing journey with a move to Belper Town in June 2023. Prior to joining the Nailers, James had been with former manager Grant Black at Ossett United, whom he joined a dual registration from Scarborough Athletic, where he played a big role in their promotion to the National League North in 2021/22. James was originally a Rotherham United academy player and since then he has played for Harrogate Town, Stalybridge Celtic, Hyde United and Mickleover Sports in his career and will add ability, experience and know-how to the Nailers squad.

TODAY'S VISITORS



BRODIE LITCHFIELD (Forward) Brodie has enjoyed a significant measure of success in senior non-league circles. A former Sheffield United youngster, Brodie performed consistently well for the Bracken Moor club, eventually earning himself a move to FC United of Manchester. His stay with the FC United was relatively brief and following an impressive pre-season at Gainsborough Trinity, he duly signed for the Lincolnshire club. More moves followed to Mickleover Sports and Ossett United before he joined the Nailers just before the season curtailment in March 2020. Brodie won the Manager's 'Player of the Season award' in 2021/22 following his best-ever campaign for the club. He left the Nailers at the end of the 2022/23 season to join Basford United but rejoined in November 2023.

LEWIS AUSTIN (Midfield) Lewis is a current member of the Belper Town academy where his impressive displays have earned him a place in the first team squad. He made his debut for the first team as a substitute in the Derbyshire Senior Cup against Ashbourne Town in December 2022 and scored within minutes of his arrival onto the pitch. Lewis is a player with a great future in the game.

ADAM BESSADI (Midfield) Adam is a lightning quick winger who joined the Nailers from Leicestershire outfit, Kirby Muxloe in July 2023. Adam's early career saw him play most of his football in the south of England including spells at Aylesbury Town and Wantage Town. Currently a student in Leicester, Adam joined Kirby Muxloe where he was spotted by Nailers' manager, Lee Attenborough, who recognised his fleet footed ability and brought him to the Raygar Stadium. He impressed enormously in the Nailer pre-season matches.

TOBY GREGORY (Midfield) Toby is a direct, attacking midfielder who likes to dribble and get at defenders. He joined the Nailers from Worksop Town, where he progressed through the under 19s and reserve side. He has time on his side to develop his game at Belper and to add a new dimension to the team's attacking options.

TODAY'S VISITORS



REVARNELLE JAMES (Forward) Revarnelle (Rev) had spells in the youth ranks at both Sheffield United and Rotherham United before joining the Under-21 squad at Oxford United in July 2018. Rev had an initial loan spell at Basford United in December 2018 and following his release by Oxford he signed for Tamworth in February 2019. He had another brief loan spell at Corby Town before a permanent move to Nuneaton Borough last season. He then rejoined Basford for the current campaign. Rev was regarded more as an impact player at Greenwich Avenue, but he will be looking for a greater contribution with the Nailers.

ZAK GOODSON (Forward) A former product of the Derby County Academy, 23-year-old Zak joined the Nailers in December 2023 from Derbyshire neighbours, Ilkeston Town. Previously, he had rejoined the Robins after professional spells with Chester and Altrincham. Zak has a knack of cutting inside his full back and hitting a screamer into the top corner (which we knew all too well at Belper) and was pivotal in Ilkeston success in gaining promotion from Step 4.

KEVIN BASTOS (Forward) Kevin is one of the most exciting players in the league after scoring 16 goals and grabbing 17 assists for Loughborough Dynamo last season, having joined the 'Moes' in summer 2021 from Tamworth. His exploits captured the attention of Basford United who paid a substantial figure for his services last season. Prior to his spell at Loughborough, Kevin played at Spalding United and before that at Ilkeston Town and Grantham. He decided to follow former manager, Lee Attenborough to Belper, signing in June 2023.

BELPER RECENT HISTORY

The club finally made it into the NPL Premier Division at the end of a hard fought 2013/14 League campaign in which they finished the regular season in fourth place. A 2-0 semi-final play-off win at Leek Town set up a home tie against Derbyshire rivals Mickleover Sports and a 1-0 success in that final game earned the Nailers the promotion they had been craving after 17 seasons in the League's lower tier.

But the 2014/15 season proved to be a major disappointment as Peter Duffield and Mick Godber resigned after a winless opening 10 games. Arriving in the hot seat was former Grantham Town manager Jimmy Albans and he was joined by his former assistant, Wayne Hallcro, later in the season but despite an encourage spell of late season form and results, the damage had been done and the club lost its place in the NPL Premier Division at the end of the campaign. Season 2015/16 saw a continued decline in playing fortunes and Albans and Hallcro were relieved of their duties in September 2015 after a dismal start to the season, to be replaced by former Derby County and Notts County defender Charlie Palmer and his assistant, Lee Barrow. The new management team steadied the ship, securing a comfortable mid-table finish and an appearance in the Derbyshire Senior Cup final against Alfreton Town, which ended with an undeserved defeat on penalties.

Another mid-table finish was secured in 2016/17 but Palmer decided to end his ties with the club and former Belper player, Anthony Danylyk and Paul Donnelly took over the managerial reins, having earned their positions through their managerial exploits at Leek Town the previous season. The pair decided to cut their ties with the club in December and former Burton Albion legend, Aaron Webster was appointed to the Nailers hot seat, assisted by ex-League professional, Lee Williamson. Their tenure started brightly enough but ended with a disappointing conclusion to the League campaign with six straight defeats, after which they were both relieved of their posts.

Following into the Nailers management roles came Grant Black, who was assisted by former fans' favourite Mick Norbury. Prior to taking the reins at the Belper Town, Grant had been manager at Ossett Town and led the club away from the relegation zone and into the play-off final, all in the space of 16 months. Building a squad from scratch, Grant and Mick masterminded a superb turnaround in form, with the team finishing a creditable ninth place at the end of the 2018/19 season.

The Nailers continued to build on their upturn in fortunes and when the 2019/20 season was brought to a premature curtailment in March 2020. The Nailers were in a healthy position in the play-off places and were looking forward to a Derbyshire Senior Cup Final at Derby County's Pride Park Stadium.

BELPER RECENT HISTORY

Promotion ambitions and cup success were cruelly denied when the season was declared null and void. But, the undoubted highlight of the season was a great Emirates FA Cup run that ended in the 4th Qualifying Round with a 2-1 defeat at Notts County in front of 5,729 fans, including 1,800 from Belper. It was certainly a day to remember for Nailers supporters.

Then, the further lockdown in October 2020 brought another season to a shuddering halt with the club in a promising league position again. When football recommenced in earnest for the 2021/22 season, hopes were high for another successful campaign and following a encouraging league season, a play-off berth was confirmed after a dramatic late winning goal at Loughborough Dynamo. What followed, were two sensational performances to win 2-1 in the first play-off match at Stamford (this despite conceding 10 goals by the Lincolnshire club in the two league encounters) and then a 1-0 success at Chasetown to finally secure Premier Division status, eight years after their previous success. The Nailers found life in the Premier Division much harder that they expected and were never really out of the relegation places throughout the campaign.

Despite the occasional bright spot, the club suffered too many narrow defeats and matters came to a head when Grant Black resigned his position in January 2023. The club immediately appointed former Corby Town manager, Lee Attenborough and assistant Matt Wain, for the remainder of the season but the damage was already done and the club eventually succumbed to relegation once again.

Lee and Matt have spent the 2023 close season, completed revamping the playing squad and have assembled a mixture of experienced players and emerging talent that they hope will be able to compete for promotion once again.



Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!


