Our opponents today are CLEETHORPES TOWN FC who arrive at Belle Stadium after their long journey from North Lincolnshire. "The Owls" are always a tough team to overcome and are renowned for playing an entertaining brand of football. They are currently sitting in a mid-table place in the Eastern Division rankings but will be eager to make a strong finish to rise as high as possible with ten games still to play.

Cleethorpes Town have made remarkable progress since the formation of their Senior Team in 2003. They started in the local Lincolnshire Leagues and quickly gained promotion to the North Counties East League, making rapid steps until a momentous season in 2016-2017. After some superb displays in the FA Vase, they



reached Wembley to face the outstanding South Shields FC and put in a creditable performance before losing in a memorable Final. Their ultimate disappointment was tempered by their NCEL success as they impressively clinched the League Title and deservedly gained promotion to the Northern Premier League for the first time.

During their time in charge, Joint Team Managers Tim Lowe and Liam Dickens have continued to improve their squad since they were appointed last March, bringing in some experienced players and ensuring that they have taken advantage of the Club's excellent Junior set-up by promoting some of the outstanding products of their Youth Academy.

We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this afternoon. Referee Connor Scott makes the short journey from Ryton, and he is joined by his Assistant Referees John Davison from Houghton-le-Spring and Jack Whitfield from Whitley Bay. Our FA Match Observer today is Brian Reilly from Consett.

Let's look forward to a competitive match. Enjoy the game.

#### **BILLY MONTAGUE – CLUB SECRETARY**



The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as the Football Section of a Print Works Sports & Social Club. Long-serving Club stalwart John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, formed the team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on a public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics FC. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being League Champions twice and League Cup Winners once – the club felt a

need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the

Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011-2012 when, under the

Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2-0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the "Club Playing Name" must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generaous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved more difficult than expected in the NPL North West Division and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any real consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table.

After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston started the 21-22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division much stronger and finished in sixth-place, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs. Last Season saw yet another upgrade in playing strength and more stadium improvements but the same disappointing final finish of sixth from top.

In a very competitive Division, we will have to go that extra step in the 2023-24 season if we are to achieve our aim of promotion but under the guidance of our new Team Manager Jon McDonald and his Coaches we will do our best!





### CRAIG BAXTER (Defender)

Craig Baxter is a defensively strong and composed right back who brings a wealth of experience of playing higher up in leagues to the Dunston back line. Craig has a proven track record of success, a key player for The Mariners over a five-season spell and making 188 appearances and played an integral role in the Gateshead side which reached the National League playoff final at Wembley Stadium in the 2013/14 season.

Described as rock solid at the back and strong going forward, Baxter's signing was a major coup for Dunston UTS FC, and Craig's addition was obvious, with the full back picking up the 2021/22 managers player of the season, players player of the season and committee's player of the season.






Matty made his first start for the club in pre-season, putting in a Man of the Match performance against National League South side, Dartford FC.




### DALE PEARSON (Forward)

### DAVID ROBINSON (Midfielder)

An industrious and combative midfielder, Robinson joins ahead of the 2023-24 season where he will provide experience and quality to the middle of the park.

### PHIL TURNBULL (Midfielder)

Central midfielder Phil Turnbull is described as fiercely competitive player and joined the club along with ex-teammate Craig Baxter in 2021. A permanent move to Gateshead in 2008 saw him play over 300 games for the Tynesiders and he played a vital role in the National League season which saw the Heed reach Wembley.

He then moved to Darlington in 2015 where he would gain promotion to The National League North in his first season.

A move to his hometown club South Shields 2018 saw Turnbull continue his good form. He has been key to the recent playing success at South Shields but with the club moving to full time Chris Swailes wasted no time in bringing the vastly experienced and talented midfielder to the UTS Stadium.

He scooped a number of awards at the end of the 2022/23 season following a superb season, including the Fred Foulis Committee Player of the Season award.

#### LIAM THEAR (Forward)

Liam Thear is one of the clubs longest serving players and has just shy of 200 appearances heading into the 2023/24 season. He scooped the Goal of the Season award at the end of the 2022/23 season following an audacious lob away at Stocksbridge Park Steels.







#### Dunston FC 3-1 Belper Town (09/03/24)



Dunston made it five games unbeaten with the perfect display at 'home' against fellow promotion contenders, Belper Town.

Jack Maskell continued his impressive form as he bagged a hattrick to take his tally to 17 for the season. Belper caused a late scare as Karl Demidh pulled one back with ten minutes to go, but Dunston were able to pull through for the three points as Maskell netted his third in stoppage time.

Jon McDonald made one change from Tuesday's 2-2 draw against Stocksbridge as Craig Baxter returned to the starting XI in place of Jude Swailes, with the skipper Michael Pearson slotting into the centre of defence.

Dunston began the game looking dangerous as JJ Chrisp almost opened the scoring inside the opening five minutes. The young midfielder took aim from the edge of the box but was denied by a superb diving save from Daniel Moore.

With just shy of 20 minutes played, Belper had a great chance of

their own as Zak Goodson found himself with time on the edge of the box and cracked the crossbar with a thunderous effort.

Despite the opportunity for The Nailers, Dunston continued to look the better side and were once again denied by Moore as the Belper 'keeper pulled off a double save, denying Dale Pearson and Craig Baxter in quick succession.

Inevitably, the opening goal of the contest came from the in-form 19-year-old centre forward, Jack Maskell, with 35 minutes on the clock. A Phil Turnbull corner wasn't dealt with by the away side, and Sado Djalo played the ball into the feet of Maskell, who slotted into the bottom corner with an excellent finish on the spin.

With the first half approaching its climax, Dunston continued to search for a second. Phil Turnbull fired a free kick narrowly over the crossbar, before Maskell found himself one-on-one with Moore, but Moore was able to stop the scuffed effort.

Once again, Dunston began the second half brightly as they looked to double their lead. A JJ Chrisp cross was met by the head of Djalo, but his header was straight into the gloves of Moore. Chrisp and Robinson both chanced their luck from range but were unable to hit the target.

With just over an hour played, Maskell finally gave Dunston a two-goal cushion. On the counterattack, Dunston carved Belper open down the left-hand side. The ball fell to the feet of Maskell who lashed his effort into the top corner leaving Moore with no chance.

The Nailers were never out of the contest at two goals down, and Demidh came close to halving the deficit with a header at the back post that went narrowly wide on 68 minutes.

Down the other end, Maskell could've bagged his hat-trick with a header on 74 minutes as he was denied by another diving save from Moore.

With 83 minutes played, Belper Town found themselves well and truly back in the game as Demidh pulled one back. The number nine bundled the ball over the line from closerange following a free kick that was swung into the box.

Despite the minor setback, Dunston had more chances to finally put the game to bed. JJ Chrisp came close again as he fired an effort towards the bottom corner only to be denied by Moore. The ball then fell to David Robinson on the edge of the box who drilled a low effort at goal, but again Moore made the save.

Deep in stoppage time, it was finally game, set and match. The man of the moment, Jack Maskell, secured his first hat-trick for the club as he raced onto a through ball from Wayne Phillips, dribbled towards goal, and slotted past Moore.

Dunston remain second in the Pitching In Northern Premier League table after the victory.

#### **CLEETHORPES HISTORY**

The 2023/24 season is the Owls' 7th as proud members of the Northern Premier League and Cleethorpes Town has certainly come a long way in its relatively short history.

Initially formed in 1998 as Lincolnshire Soccer School, it was the brainchild of former Grimsby Town player Tommy Watson. The team was an immediate success, with both & girls across every age group ensuring that the club began to grow quickly.

Two decades ago, a flagship senior team was established. In the Owls' first season in the Lincolnshire League, a creditable fourth place finish was secured. After being rebranded as Cleethorpes Town, the club has developed into an important community asset. Over 35 teams, competing at every level of local and regional football, represent Clee, making the Owls one of the largest providers of sport in the area.

The excellent array of teams and high-quality coaching saw the club awarded the Football England accredited status, which underlines the commitment to provide an exceptional product, alongside all-important exercise & Description of the exception of the excepti

This development and evolution have, of course, been spearheaded by the first team. With the arrival of a new manager, the club finished third in Lincolnshire League in 2011. Silverware was secured as well, by defeating Heckington United in the Supplementary Cup final at Sincil Bank.

New heights were scaled the following year, with Clee securing a "double", becoming Champions of the Lincolnshire League and holding aloft the Challenge Cup. This success saw the club accepted into the Northern Counties East League.

Our first season in the NCEL saw us finish fourth in Division One table, with some impressive victories along the way, and was generally a period of consolidation 2013/14 began with a change of management and Marcus Newell appointed. This proved to be the catalyst for a great period in our history.

A long unbeaten streak meant the Owls were top of the league at Christmas. However, a slow start to the New Year left a difficult task. Nevertheless, with the pressure at its highest, Clee surged through the pack to clinch the title with a game to spare Life in the NCEL Premier Division saw a significant rise in the level of opposition teams.

However, after a fine run in FA Cup (defeating Gresley & Carlton Town), Clee adapted well to their elevation – finishing 4th and reaching the final of the League Cup.

#### **CLEETHORPES HISTORY**

The campaign concluded with a trophy in July 2015! Representing the Northern Counties East League in the Toolstation Cup in Bristol, where the team encountered Willand Rovers. A nine-goal thriller ensued, with the Owls edging it 5-4.

After a slow start, season 2015/16 then prompted a tremendous vein of form. The Owls finished third, reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and won an exhilarating League Cup final at Garforth Town FC – defeating rivals Tadcaster Albion 3-2.

Hopes were high amongst the faithful in August 2016, not many though could have predicted the scale of success that unfolded! The field in the NCEL Premier Division was left trailing in Clee's wake. A brand of exciting, attacking football was served up week after week. The title was secured at Athersley Recreation and the Owls smashed records – 108 points, +99 goal difference and a staggering 144 goals. As well as this, Deeping Rangers were beaten 1-0 in the final of the Lincolnshire Senior Trophy at Sincil Bank to snaffle another trophy.

Perhaps the real story of 2016/17 (and certainly the icing on the cake!) was a trip to Wembley! Trailing 1-0 at Emley in the opening tie with less than 10 minutes remaining, the "arch" seemed a remote prospect. However, in a typical never-say-die performance, two strikes turned it wound in Clee's favour. Bootle, Billingham Town & Atherton Collieries were all beaten, and a quarter-final in the capital awaited. A carnival atmosphere amongst the travelling Owls ensured the team rose to the occasion, an emphatic 5-2 win over Southall followed – the dream was very much alive!

A 2-legged semi-final against Bromsgrove Sporting came out the hat. The first-leg in Worcestershire was watched by over 3,300 spectators. Cheered on by a partisan support, Sporting opened the scoring and the Owls had to dig deep in the second period to grab a priceless equaliser.

The return at Bradley Community Stadium had just under 1,200 people packed inside to see Clee gain a 1 st minute lead. As time wore on, and with excitement at fever-pitch, the Owls defended resolutely to win 2-1 on aggregate. Wild scenes of celebration followed, as the enormity of reaching a national final sank in.

The showpiece at Wembley, with around 5,000 or so travelling from NE Lincolnshire, resulted in a 4-0 verdict for South Shields. That is the bare facts – however, everyone connected with the Owls still had a great time! A culmination of a lot of hard work had borne fruit.

The honeymoon from Wembley continued in the NPL. Seven straight wins seemed to make back-to-back promotions a distinct possibility. However, an administrative error meant a hefty points deduction and this, coupled with a dip in form, saw the Owls finish an honourable tenth in the 2017/18 campaign.

## **CLEETHORPES HISTORY**

Despite a best ever run in the FA Cup, the Owls languished at the bottom of the table in October 2018. This led to a change in the hotseat, and incoming Dave Smith oversaw an upsurge in fortunes. A consistent set of results almost secured a play-off, which was frustratingly denied.

Following on from the 2 curtailed campaigns due to Covid restriction, Clee finished 3rd in the East Division in 2022. Ultimate heartbreak though, narrowly losing 2-1 to Stockton Town in the play-off semi-finals. A notable journey in the FA Cup was ended by National North outfit Curzon Ashton in the 3rd Qualifying Round.

Last year was a tumultuous one, with two changes in the management set-up. Dave Smith departed in October to be replaced by Nathan Arnold. Unfortunately, things didn't work-out for the ex-Grimsby Town man, who left during March.

We are now jointly managed by two of our Wembley heroes, namely Tim Lowe & Liam Dickens. Everyone at the Owls is looking forward to an enjoyable 2023/24 season!




