The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as the Football Section of a Print Works Sports & Social Club. Long-serving Club stalwart John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, formed the team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on a public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics FC. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being League Champions twice and League Cup Winners once – the club felt a

need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the

Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011-2012 when, under the

Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2-0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the "Club Playing Name" must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generaous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved more difficult than expected in the NPL North West Division and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any real consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table.

After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston started the 21-22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division much stronger and finished in sixth-place, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs. Last Season saw yet another upgrade in playing strength and more stadium improvements but the same disappointing final finish of sixth from top.

In a very competitive Division, we will have to go that extra step in the 2023-24 season if we are to achieve our aim of promotion but under the guidance of our new Team Manager Jon McDonald and his Coaches we will do our best!



HARRY BARCLAY (Defender)



Jack was also selected to represent England Universities for a round of friendly fixtures against Wycombe Wanderers and Gateshead in May 2023.








JUDE SWAILES (Defender)

PHIL TURNBULL (Midfielder)





REPORT | Bridlington (A)

Bridlington Town 0-3 Dunston FC (23/12/23)



Dunston recorded a fourth successive win and third consecutive clean sheet with an impressive 3-0 away win at Bridlington Town.

Two goals from David Robinson, and a twelfth goal of the season for Dale Pearson, moved Dunston back up into the playoffs.

Jon McDonald made two changes from last week's win against Ossett. JJ Chrisp came in for the injured Chris McDonald, and Jordan Lamb replaced Richard Coulson in the forward line.

With Dunston full of confidence after recent performances, it was the perfect start as David Robinson opened the scoring after just six minutes.

Phil Turnbull delivered a perfectly executed free kick into the box and Robinson was lurking at the back post to head home from close-range.

The first half was far from a classic with much of play in the middle of the park. The next shot on goal didn't come until the 25th minute when Dale Pearson got onto the end of a long ball over the top of the Brid defence however, James Hitchcock rushed out quickly and smothered the effort on goal.

A similar chance arose eight minutes later when Jack Maskell played the ball over the top to Dale Pearson, but again Hitchcock pulled off the save to keep the score at 0-1 heading into the break.

Dunston began the second half looking threatening and ultimately doubled the lead nine minutes into the half. David Robinson grabbed his brace in spectacular fashion.

From 25 yards out, the Dunston number 10 pulled the trigger and curled the ball past Hitchcock, leaving the Bridlington 'keeper with no chance.

In full control of the game, it continued to be one-way traffic as Jordan Lamb came close on 62 minutes, but his effort was blocked.

Five minutes later, Dale Pearson continued his excellent goal scoring form this season. The Dunston forward picked the ball up outside the box and drilled a powerful effort past Hitchcock for his twelfth of the season.

With the game looking comfortable, Jon McDonald made some changes as he introduced Sado Djalo and Richard Coulson. The latter almost made an instant impact as the ball dropped to Coulson inside the box, but Hitchcock produced a fine save to deny him.

Things got a little bit interesting in the final few minutes of the game as the hosts searched for a route back into the game. Glen Sani looked lively down the left and came close in the 85th minute as he skied an effort over the bar from a few yards out.

With 88 minutes played, the floodlights caused havoc as they packed in just before a Bridlington corner. The players left the field and returned ten minutes later once the lights were back on to finish the final few minutes of the game.

Sani came close twice in stoppage time as the Bridlington winger once again missed the target from a yard out before forcing Dan Staples into his first save of the game.

Ultimately, Dunston held firm for a third straight clean sheet and fourth straight win, climbing up to 5th place in the Pitching In Northern Premier League East table.

NEWTON AYCLIFFE HISTORY

It is difficult to find the definitive date when Newton Aycliffe Football Club was formed. There is evidence of a Newton Aycliffe Rangers in 1951 playing in the Darlington and District League. In 1954-57 there was a NAFC playing in the Auckland and District League, firstly at Sugar Hill sports ground and then Burn Lane sports ground. There then appears to be a gap. There is a report in the Newtonian in 1965 setting out the Newton Rangers Club was formed in 1961/2 and playing home games in Darlington. A further team, Newton Aycliffe AFC was formed in 1964 as a soccer section of the NA sports club, playing its first season in 1964/5 in the Darlington Weekend League, playing home matches at Simpasture playing fields. Newton Aycliffe Rangers later played on a pitch near Aycliffe Stock Car Stadium. In

1967/68 The Rangers won the Auckland and District League Div 2 Championship (playing home games at Croxdale Welfare). By 1968-69 they had moved to Moore Lane as part of Newton Aycliffe Sports Club and had a reserve team in the Auckland and District league Division 2. 1969 saw Aycliffe Rangers reach the Semi Final of the Durham Challenge Cup, losing to Ferryhill Athletic after beating another Northern League side Stanley United on a very heavy Moore Lane pitch!

In 1969-70 a team named Newton Aycliffe SC played in the Auckland and District League Div 1 and a reserve team played in Div 2. This team won the League Challenge Cup in both 1969-70 and 70-71. As Newton Aycliffe FC the team later moved to the Teesside League and joined the Wearside League in 1984 before folding from it during the 1993-94 season. And although the current club was re-formed a number of years ago, competing successfully in the Darlington & District League its re-emergence from 2007-08 was nothing short of phenomenal.

Having smashed their way into the Start To Learn Northern League in emphatic fashion – winning back-to-back league titles; Durham Alliance (2007-08) and the Wearside League (2008-09) – Allan Oliver's side built on their inaugural campaign at Northern League level by topping the table for a huge eight months as they finished seven points clear of their nearest rivals in the 2010-11 title race.

The club's development off the field has been as rapid as that on it, as Moore Lane Park gradually transformed into a ground befitting a club at Step 5 of the National League "pyramid" System – the club averaged 191 attendances in 2009-10, the fifth highest average crowd in the Northern League and 222 in 2010-11, again bettered by just four teams!

Of course, the club owes a lot to Sedgefield Council's Local Improvement Programme and the Football Foundation for providing grants to afford the facilities, but the football club are also indebted to the support received from Newton Aycliffe Sports Club who continue to be a massive backer and supporter of the club's transformation.

NEWTON AYCLIFFE HISTORY

Seated accommodation was delivered in the spring of 2010 and after the assistance from local firm Finlay Structures and a team of volunteers dedicated to the club, standing accommodation for over 100 persons was installed in February 2011, ready for the club's transition into a top-flight outfit.

Under the management of Peter Dixon the highlight of 2015/2016 was winning the Durham Challenge Cup, but added to that we had our best ever runs in the FA Cup (2nd Qualifying Round Replay) & FA Vase (5th Round-last 16). We also had our highest finish (at the time) in the Ebac Northern League (6th).

In December 2016 Deano Browne & a returning Danny Mellanby joined as joint-manager, steering the Club 9th in Division One, following that with a 14 th place finish in 2017/2018. For 2018/2019 Danny elected to move to a new role on the club's committee concentrating on youth development. Andrew Jinks & former skipper Sean Tarling came in as Assistant Managers.

A poor start to the 2018/2019 season brought a change of management with former Team Northumbria manager Colin Stromsoy joining in early 2019. His input led to an improvement in form which resulted in a 12 th place finish in the league. This was developed further with the team sitting 5 th in Division One when Covid-19 brought the season to a premature end.

Further works to the ground took place over the summer of 2020. New drains were laid to help reduce the number of postponements due to waterlogging. At the same time a grant from the Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership allowed for the resurfacing of the path leading to the ground & the construction of a turnstile. A further grant from GAMP in 2021 allowed the floodlights to be replaced with LED lanterns.

Colin Stromsoy left the club late in 2021 with former Sunderland player Brian Atkinson returning to manage his hometown club. Under Brian's leadership the Club finished the season in 4th place in Division One, its highest ever league position at that time.

Season 2022-2023 was the best in the Club's history as Atkinson produced a team which won the Ebac Northern League Division One. In the process the team went unbeaten at home, dropping just two points at the SecuriCorp Stadium.



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!


