Northern Premier League East Division game.

The original fixture should have been played on Saturday 4th November but was postponed due to a badly waterlogged pitch. It was postponed again last week for a waterlogged pitch once again.

Our opponents tonight are SHEFFIELD FC who arrive at the UTS Stadium after their long journey from South Yorkshire. It's an honour for Dunston FC to play host to the undisputed "Oldest Football Club" in the world! Sheffield FC were founded on 24th October 1857, almost six years before the formation of the Football Association in 1863. The Club insisted that most of the rules that they had formulated were adopted by the FA to govern the



very early games that took place around that time. The very first Inter-Club Match was played between Sheffield FC and their near neighbours Hallam FC on Boxing Day in 1860.

Games between our two Clubs are usually tough encounters and last season was no exception to the norm since we met on a regular basis after Dunston's promotion to the NPL in 2019. The very friendly relationship enjoyed between the Clubs has resulted in some good natured but fiercely contested games. Dunston FC managed to come out on top in both of our meetings last season when two goals by Carl Finnigan saw us win by 2-0 at the UTS Stadium in October 2022 in a hard-fought encounter. The return at Sheffield in February of this year was an another very competitive affair and this time we also ran out winners by two goals to nil thanks to a penalty by Terry Galbraith and the clinching goal by Richard Coulson.

Dunston FC will have to be at their best to overcome a spirited Sheffield FC side who can be at their most dangerous when underestimated. Their Team Manager Ryan Cresswell has assembled a versatile and competitive playing squad who relish a battle for the points.

We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this evening. Referee Scott Henry travels from Carlisle and his Assistant Referees are Elliot Cowens from Wallsend and Bernard Law from Kirkby Stephen. Our FA Observer is Graeme Fyvie from Sunderland.

Supporters old and new are very well appreciated and we hope you enjoy your visit to the UTS Stadium this evening. BILLY MONTAGUE – CLUB SECRETARY



The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as the Football Section of a Print

Works Sports & Social Club. Long-serving Club stalwart John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, formed the team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on a public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics FC. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being

need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second

Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the

Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011-2012 when, under the

Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2-0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the newfound momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record

crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the "Club Playing Name" must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the

situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generaous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved more difficult than expected in the NPL North West Division and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any real consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table.

After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston started the 21-22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division much stronger and finished in sixth-place, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs. Last Season saw yet another upgrade in playing strength and more stadium improvements but the same disappointing final finish of sixth from top.

In a very competitive Division, we will have to go that extra step in the 2023-24 season if we are to achieve our aim of promotion but under the guidance of our new Team Manager Jon McDonald and his Coaches we will do our best!





HARRY BARCLAY (Defender)



His time at St James' Park was hampered by an injury but now, Harry is looking to start over at the UTS Stadium. Still only 19-years-old, Barclay is a one to watch out for and will be looking to gain some valuable experience in the men's game this season.



CRAIG BAXTER (Defender)

Jack was also selected to represent England Universities for a round of friendly fixtures against Wycombe Wanderers and Gateshead in May 2023.







The midfield enforcer could prove to be a crucial signing for Jon McDonald ahead of the upcoming season.








He has a keen eye for goal, and brings with him pace, power and a lethal finish.

During his time at Dunston, Michael has collected a Northern League winners medal, Northern League Cup medal and JR Cleator Cup Winners medal.




JUDE SWAILES (Defender)

PHIL TURNBULL (Midfielder)

Central midfielder Phil Turnbull is described as fiercely competitive player and joined the club along with ex-teammate Craig Baxter in 2021. Alongside his studies, he completed a three year placements at Park View Academy of Sport and was able to develop his skills as a practitioner.





He can, and has, scored all types of goals, he is a very mature lad in how he plays and still only 25 years old. He has had experience at this level with Cleethorpes Town, whilst also excelling at Eccleshill United last season, where he scored 25 goals.

STEPHEN BROGAN (Defender) Experienced left-sided player "Brogues" joins Club from Stalybridge Celtic, having started his career with Rotherham United, he went on to play for numerous non- league clubs, including North Ferriby United, Forest Green Rovers, Alfreton, Buxton, Boston United, Spennymoor Town and Gainsborough Trinity.

CALLUM BROOKS (Midfield) Talented and lively midfielder Brooks joins Sheffield FC for the 2023/24 season on a dual registration with United Counties League side Rainworth Miners Welfare. Callum has appeared in the majority of the Club's pre-season games, and has impressed with some energetic performances.

JOSHUA BURNS (Defender) Josh is now in his third season with the Club, having joined from Stafford Rangers in 2020, whilst also having a spell in between at Frickley Athletic. Has had experience with Chesterfield and has also played for Lincoln City.

RORY COLEMAN (Defender) Coleman started his career in the Football League at Scunthorpe United before dropping down into the non-league game and playing for teams such as Ilkeston, Stocksbridge, Leek Town, Coalville and most recently Grantham Town. Another player to have links with the Millers, Greenhouse is a powerful player for his tender age, possessing speed, strength, and a few secret weapons.



EDD HALL (Goalkeeper) Someone who has been admired by Sheffield FC for some time, Edd finally joined the World's First in March 2023 from Ossett United. Hall has played in goal for Yorkshire's international side and counts Bradford Park Avenue, Farsley Celtic and Brighouse Town among his former employers.

LUKE MANGHAM (Forward) Luke joined Club from Belper Town in June 2023. He originally joined Belper from Stocksbridge Park Steels in 2022 where he was their leading scorer in each of his last three seasons at the club. He also had earlier spells at Garforth Town, Frickley Athletic, Ossett Town and Goole.

HARRY MITCHELL (Midfield) Combative midfielder 'Mitch' made the step up to the NPL last season after impressing for NCEL team Handsworth the season before and didn't disappoint with several man of the match performances, developing and maturing as the season progressed.

NATHAN MODEST (Forward) Nathan re-joined Sheffield FC midway through last season from Grantham, having appeared way back in 2011/12 following his release from Sheffield Wednesday. Has spent the last decade scoring and plying his trade at various clubs, including Worksop Town, Lincoln United, Gloucester City, Hednesford Town, Rainworth Miners Welfare and Bridlington Town.

CURTIS MORRISON (Forward) Curtis joined in June 2023 from Stalybridge Celtic having started his career at Chesterfield back in 2016, making his professional debut in the EFL cup. He had youth loan spells at Gainsborough Trinity and Matlock Town before signing for Guiseley in 2017, where he spent a couple of seasons, again going out on loan to Buxton and Matlock Town.



BENEFIT NDLOVU (Forward) Zimbabwe born Benni is one to watch, with pace and skill to spare, and an eye for goal, this lad has a big future ahead of him. Having excelled at Sheffield FC Youth, Development and Reserves teams, Benni was due to make the natural step up to the NPL side last summer but was side-lined for the full season following a freak injury. Now fully fit, he is aiming to be a permanent fixture in the First Team squad.

MARC NEWSHAM (Forward) Another one of the many in the Sheffield FC squad with Rotherham United tie, Newie started his career with Millers back in 2005, where he made 48 first team appearances, having had a spell on loan at The World's First. He has since played in Non-League football for Gainsborough Trinity, Ilkeston Town, Boston United - where he made over 200 appearances) and Matlock Town. He returned to the Home of Football in 2018, taking up the captain's armband just a year later.

RILEY NOBLE (Defender) Riley is currently the captain of the Sheffield FC Development squad, and is seen as a promising prospect, signing first team forms after impressing in pre-season. A free- flowing full back, who can look equally as comfortable defending, as well as joining up in attack.

JORDAN PIERREPONT (Goalkeeper) Pierrepont is viewed as one of the best young prospects at his age, joining Sheffield FC from Basford United. Jordan spent much of last season impressing at Frickley Athletic whilst on loan, having joined Basford from Heanor Town.

JAKE SCOTT (Midfield) A tenacious, holding midfielder by trade, Jake joins Sheffield Club from Premier League Mickleover FC where he was club captain. Scott's other former clubs include Barnsley, Shaw Lane, Worksop Town, Bradford Park Avenue, Gainsborough Trinity and Guiseley AFC.



ALFIE SMITH (Defender) A physically imposing and no-nonsense defender, Smith joins Club from local rivals Handsworth, where he made his mark as a consistent performer. Having started his journey with Sheffield Wednesday, Alfie then joined Swallownest Miners Welfare, where he served as club skipper.

ADAM WATSON (Midfield) "Watto" joined Sheffield from fellow Northern Premier League East side Worksop Town in 2022. Beginning his career in Leeds United academy, Watson has also featured for Northern Counties East Football League Side Rossington Main and Grantham Town.

JAMIE YATES (Midfield) "Yatesy" is a lively, experienced midfielder, and is also Sheffield FC's Assistant Manager. Another whose former clubs include Rotherham United, Boston United, Gainsborough Trinity and Matlock Town. Jamie can play on either wing, central midfield, and worked his way through the Rotherham United youth setup before playing 34 league games for the club.

EARLY FOOTBALL

Versions of football evolved in many early civilisations, example of these can be found in ancient China, Greece and Rome. In England the original games were played between villages in fields and streets. This 'Mob Football' involved hundreds of players and was little more than prolonged and violent street battles. In the 19th century a more refined version of the game grew in popularity within the public schools and universities, each playing to their own sets of rules.

THE BIRTH OF SHEFFIELD FOOTBALL CLUB

During the 1850s the enthusiasm and influence of ex-public school and university students spread the popularity of the game around Sheffield. In the summer of 1857 William Prest and Nathaniel Creswick agreed that the game would be a splendid candidate for organised sport during the winter months. The pair wrote to the Public Schools for information, regarding their varying rules, with the aim of drawing up a set of laws embodying the best points from each. On October 24th, 1857, the world's first football club was born in a greenhouse. Among the first rules drawn up were laws asserting that "no hacking or tripping up is fair under any circumstances", "no player may be held or pulled over" and "it is not lawful to take the ball off the ground [using hands]". Upon the formation of the Football Association in 1863, Sheffield Club's insistence on these laws helped lead the evolution of the game we recognise globally today. Heading, crossbars, corner kicks, free-kicks for fouls, throw- ins, a half-time change of ends and floodlit matches can all be traced to the innovators of Sheffield FC.

EARLY YEARS

Initially early matches, such as Married men v Unmarried, were played between club members. Records also show games against local army sides. Following victory over the 58th Army Regiment in 1860 a local report stated that, "most of the officers were adept at the game, having, in their younger days, played in the public-school matches, and the victory of the civilians was quite unexpected." Following the birth of Hallam F.C., the

world's first inter-club game took place on Boxing Day in 1860. The match "was conducted with good temper and in a friendly spirit", concluding in a 2-0 win for Sheffield. For several years all matches were played locally, against a rising number of new sides, before the first 'out of town' match was played in Nottinghamshire in 1865. In 1866 Sheffield became the first non-London side to play under FA Laws when they met London at Battersea Park. The FA Cup was founded in 1871 and in its third season Sheffield became the first northern side to take part and the first non-London side to win a tie. They succeeded in reaching the quarter finals in this and two further seasons also, 1876 and 1878, the club's support helping the FA Cup nearly treble in size and become a nationwide competition.

1872 saw the first international game, between England and Scotland in Glasgow, with Sheffield's Charles Clegg playing for the England side. Clegg would later go on to be Chairman, and President, of the FA and receive a knighthood for his services to the game.

From the 1880s onwards the rise of professionalism and Sheffield Club's firm insistence on retaining their amateur status saw them overtaken and overshadowed by other sides in the area. During these years the very survival of the club owed much to the leadership of former players Harry Chambers and Harry Broughton Willey. It wasn't all doom and gloom though! In fact Sheffield enjoyed possibly their greatest hour in 1904 when they won the Amateur Cup, beating Ealing 3-1 at Valley Parade, Bradford.

YORKSHIRE LEAGUE

1949 brought admission to the Yorkshire League and a resurgence, which saw the side promoted to Division 1 in their third season and reach the League Cup final in 1953. In 1957 they celebrated their Centenary year and reached their first Sheffield Hallamshire FA Cup final in 1962. After a period of yo-yoing between divisions the 1977 side were crowned Division 2 Champions and reached that season's FA Vase final at Wembley. They established themselves as a top division side in the Yorkshire League, lifting the League Cup in 1978, before joining the newly founded Northern Counties East League in 1982.

NORTHERN COUNTIES LEAGUE

The Division 1 title was won in both 1989 and 1991 and a first Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup win came in 1994. In 2001 the club acquired a permanent ground, for the first time, when moving to its current home. After the turn of the century the side began to consistently challenge for promotion, also winning the League Cup and Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup twice apiece. The 2006/07 season ended with a 2nd place finish and promotion to the Northern Premier League.

NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE

Club made an instant impact in reaching the 2008 play-off final, narrowly losing only on penalties. That first season also saw games against Inter Milan and Ajax at Bramall Lane, as part of the 150th birthday celebrations. The side have reached the NPL play-offs a further 3 times in addition to lifting the Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup in 2008 and 2010. Last season was a tough one as we went into the final months of the season near the bottom of the table, having taken just one point from six games and with a new management team. Under the duo of Ryan Cresswell and Jamie Yates the side won two of their next three matches and but a disappointing loss at home to bottom of the table Pickering at the start of April meant relegation remained a very real danger. The side showed true grit though and just a single defeat over the final five fixtures with victory on the final day enough to secure safety. After a turbulent term, hopes are high that a settled side can continue that late season form and bring about a much more successful campaign in 2023/2024.

Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!


