Spread of Covid-19	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DUTS Players • DUTS officials • The public using entering the ground/bar • Visiting players • Visiting officials 	<p>Promoting good hygiene:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide hand sanitisers upon entry to the stands, turnstiles, toilets, clubhouse, dugouts, cafeteria, player and officials changing rooms. All who enter the ground will be asked to sanitise their hands. • Clearly direct people to where they can wash their hands (hand sanitising station and the toilets) • Ensure that all handwashing stations are in good working order and provide soap, water and hand sanitiser. • Provide hygiene standards promotional poster and signage throughout the clubhouse and around the ground. • Use disposable paper towels in handwashing facilities. • Protective face shields to be provided to bar staff <p>Keep facilities and equipment clean:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After each home game the dressing rooms and clubhouse will be cleaned and sanitised • Identify high-contact indoor touch points for more regular cleaning (e.g. door handles, grab rails, vending machines). • Follow Public Health England guidance if a COVID-19 case is reported at the facility. • Dugouts will be cleaned and sanitised before each fixture <p>Maintaining social distancing and avoiding congestion:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Social distancing will be encouraged, although it is not mandatory. • Entry to the clubhouse through front door only 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular check process (sanitiser, soap and paper towels and handwashing stations). • Daily check (promotion posters and signage). • Train all workers on new protocols and the important of good hygiene. • A responsible person to check cleaning has taken place as planned. • Weekly stock check (cleaning products). • Empty waste facilities regularly. • Train all workers on Public Health England guidance for reported COVID-1s9 cases. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DUTS officials
