We would like to extend a very warm welcome to everyone in attendance at the UTS Stadium this afternoon for this PITCHING-IN Northern Premier League East Division game.

Our opponents today are CLEETHORPE TOWN FC who arrive at the UTS Stadium after their long journey from North Lincolnshire. Just as they did last season, "The Owls" are enjoying a very successful time in the PITCHING-IN Northern Premier League East Division and are currently sitting in fourth place in the Table. If they can maintain their strong performances in the near future, they look as if they will be competing once again in the end-of-season play-offs for promotion to the PITCHING-IN NPL Premier Division.

Cleethorpes Town have made remarkable progress since the formation of their Senior Team in 2003. They started in the local Lincolnshire Leagues and quickly gained promotion to the North Counties East League, making rapid steps until a momentous season in 2016-2017. After some superb displays in the FA Vase, they reached Wembley to face the outstanding South Shields FC and put in a creditable performance before losing in a memorable Final. Their ultimate disappointment was tempered by their NCEL success as they impressively clinched the League Title and deservedly gained promotion to the Northern Premier League for the first time.

Team Manager Nathan Arnold has continued to improve his squad since his appointment in November 2021, bringing in some experienced players and also ensuring that he takes advantage of the Club's excellent Junior set-up by promoting some of the outstanding products of their Youth Academy.

We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this afternoon. Referee Givi Todua travels from Sunderland and he is joined by his Assistant Referees Matthew Harris from Gosforth and Barry Tones from Chester-le-Street. Our FA Match Observer is Ted Ilderton from Whitley Bay.

Supporters old and new are very well appreciated and we hope you enjoy your visit to the UTS Stadium this afternoon. Dunston FC Football Club History

The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit. Long-serving Club stalwart, John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, decided to form a football team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics F.C. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being League Champions twice and League Cup Winners once – the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011-2012 when, under the Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2-0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium. The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the “Club Playing Name” must not include any reference to a sponsor so the “UTS” was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved a bit more difficult than expected against tougher opponents in the NPL North West Division. Some promising early results were tempered by some setbacks, and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any great consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table. After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston added to the playing squad in time for the opening of the newly formed NPL East Division for the 2021-22 season. Some very good results were achieved but a couple of disappointing runs resulted in a final sixth-place finish, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs.

Over the years the Club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with hard work behind the scenes. The efforts of the management committee and ground staff at The UTS Stadium have ensured that the ground is a credit to the Club. Many of the backroom staff at the Club have been involved since it was founded in 1975. It's a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the Club has become one of the most successful and respected on the North East non-league scene.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

MATCH REPORT | CHESTER LE STREET TOWN (H)

FT: Dunston UTS 5-1 Chester le Street Town

Goals: Fowler (19,32) Camarda (75) Jensen (88) Pearson (89)

Dunston progressed into the Quarter Finals of the Durham FA Challenge Cup following a convincing 5-1 victory over Chester-Le-Street Town FC.

Two first half penalties from Michael Fowler put Dunston into a deserved lead, but they were pegged back when Connor Finley struck for the visitors just before half-time. Jack Camarda added a third for Dunston on 75 minutes, before late goals from Jake Jensen and Michael Pearson sealed the win.

A number of changes were made in the Dunston line-up from Saturdays draw at Tadcaster Albion. Camarda was rewarded with his first start, whilst Ursene Mouanda, Pearson, Jack Elliott and Jensen all made starts.



Dunston began strongly and Terry Galbraith had the first chance of the match, turning and firing over a volley just over from inside the box. Richard Coulson then came close, driving an effort at goal and seeing it parried wide for a corner, before Dunston were awarded a penalty when Coulson was fouled in the box. Michael Fowler stepped up to send the goalkeeper the wrong way and give Dunston the lead on 19 minutes.

It almost got better for Dunston shortly after, with Coulson going close again and drawing another fine save from Kieran Hunter in the Chester-Le-Street town goal. On 32 minutes, Dunston did get their second, and it was Fowler again on the scoresheet, dispatching another penalty following a foul on Mouanda who had surged into the box.

The visitors had their first real chance on 45 minutes, and they got themselves back in the tie when Finley picked the ball up 35 yards out and let fly – a rocket flying into the net to make the score 2-1 at the break.

The second half lacked the quality that the first did, but Dunston controlled the game well and were the only team that looked like scoring. Fowler glanced a header wide, before Jensen fired wide as Dunston chased that elusive third goal to kill the game off. Liam Thear went close for Dunston with 20 minutes to play – a flowing counter attack from Mouanda led to Elliott playing in Thear who forced a low save from Hunter.

On 75 minutes, Dunston's victory was made safe. On his full debut – Camarda was on hand to fire low into the net following pinball in the box to make the score 3-1.

Thear came close again to increasing Dunston's lead, but his shot was easily saved by Hunter. Dunston did get their fourth late on when Jensen bundled home from a corner to send Dunston convincingly into the next round.

There was even time for a fifth. This time, a corner was whipped in across the face of goal with Michael Pearson heading home past Hunter to send the Dunston fans home happy.

Club History | Cleethorpes Town

The 2022/23 season marks the Owls' Silver Jubilee and Cleethorpes Town has certainly come a long way in its relatively short history. Initially formed in 1998 as Lincolnshire Soccer School, it was the brainchild of former Grimsby Town player Tommy Watson. The team was an immediate success, with both boys and girls across every age group ensuring that the club began to grow quickly.

Less than two decades ago (in 2003), a flagship senior team was established. In the Owls' first season in the Lincolnshire League, a creditable fourth place finish was secured. After being rebranded as Cleethorpes Town, the club has developed into an important community asset. Over 35 teams, competing at every level of local and regional football, represent Clee, making the Owls one of the largest providers of sport in the area.

This development and evolution have, of course, been spearheaded by the first team. With the arrival of a new manager, the club finished third in Lincolnshire League in 2011. Silverware was secured as well, by defeating Heckington United in the Supplementary Cup Final at Sincil Bank.

New heights were scaled the following year, with Clee securing a 'double' becoming Champions of the Lincolnshire League and holding aloft the Challenge Cup. This success saw the club accepted into the Northern Counties East League (NCEL). Our first season in the NCEL saw us finish fourth in Division One table, with some impressive victories along the way, and was generally a period of consolidation

2013/14 began with a change of management and Marcus Newell appointed. This proved to be the catalyst for a great period in our history. A long unbeaten streak meant the Owls were top of the league at Christmas. However, a slow start to the New Year left a difficult task. Nevertheless, with the pressure at its highest, Clee surged through the pack to clinch the title with a game to spare.

Life in the NCEL Premier Division saw a significant rise in the level of opposition teams. However, after a fine run in the FA Cup (defeating Gresley and Carlton Town), Clee adapted well to their elevation – finishing fourth and reaching the Final of the League Cup. The campaign concluded with a trophy in July 2015. Representing the Northern Counties East League in the Toolstation Cup in Bristol, the team encountered Willand Rovers. A nine-goal thriller ensued, with the Owls edging it 5-4.

2015/16 then prompted a tremendous vein of form. The Owls finished third, reached the last 16 of the FA Vase and won an exhilarating League Cup final at Garforth Town FC – defeating rivals Tadcaster Albion 3-2. Hopes were high amongst the faithful in August 2016, few though could have predicted the scale of success that unfolded!

The field in the NCEL Premier Division was left trailing in Clee's wake. A brand of exciting, attacking football was served up week after week. The title was secured and the Owls smashed

records – 108 points, +99 goal difference and a staggering 144 goals. Perhaps the real story of 2016/17 was a trip to Wembley. Trailing 1–0 at Emley in the opening tie with less than 10 minutes remaining, the ‘arch’ seemed a remote prospect. However, in a typical never-say-die performance, two strikes turned it around in Clee’s favour.

Bootle, Billingham Town and Atherton Collieries were all beaten, and a Quarter-Final in the capital awaited. A carnival atmosphere amongst the travelling Owls ensured the team rose to the occasion, an emphatic 5–2 win over Southall followed – the dream was very much alive!

A two-legged Semi-Final against Bromsgrove Sporting came out of the hat. The first-leg in Worcestershire was watched by over 3,300 spectators. Cheered on by a partisan support, Sporting opened the scoring and the Owls had to dig deep in the second period to grab a priceless equaliser. The return at Bradley Community Stadium had just under 1,200 people packed inside to see Clee gain a first minute lead. As time wore on, and with excitement at fever-pitch, the Owls defended resolutely to win 2–1 on aggregate. Wild scenes of celebration followed, as the enormity of reaching a national final sank in.

The showpiece at Wembley, with around 5,000 or so travelling from NE Lincolnshire, resulted in a 4–0 verdict for South Shields. That is the bare facts – however, everyone connected with the Owls still had a great time! A culmination of a lot of hard work had borne fruit.

The honeymoon from Wembley continued in the Northern Premier League (NPL). Seven straight wins seemed to make back-to-back promotions a distinct possibility. However, an administrative error meant a hefty points deduction and this, coupled with a dip in form, saw the Owls finish an honourable tenth in the 2017/18 campaign.

Despite a best ever run in the FA Cup, the Owls languished at the bottom of the table in October 2018. This led to a change in the hotseat, and incoming Dave Smith oversaw an upsurge in fortunes. A consistent set of results almost secured a play-off, which was frustratingly denied in April.

Following on from the two curtailed campaigns due to Covid restriction, Clee finished third in the East Division last year. Ultimate heartbreak though, narrowly losing 2–1 to Stockton Town in the Play-off Semi-Finals. A notable journey in the FA Cup was ended by National North outfit Curzon Ashton in the Third Qualifying Round.

Now fully respected as a regular Northern Premier League outfit, the Owls approach the future full of confidence and gunning for more glory. As well as this aim, the club will never lose sight of its foundations. The Board intends to continue to plot a course that benefits the whole community.

A new chapter in the club has started in November as the club appointed Nathan Arnold as first team manager as the Club continues to evolve once again.

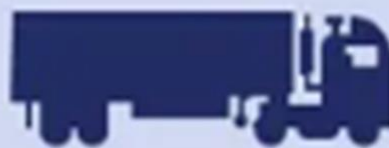

Dunston fell to a 2-0 home defeat last time out against Cleethorpes towards the back end of last season. Two goals from Brody Robertson inside 6 minutes in the second half sent the visitors home with the three points.



The Report

Dunston were compounded to a second home defeat on the spin without scoring as Cleethorpes Town took all three points at the UTS Stadium. Owls forward Brody Robertson was the difference, scoring twice in six minutes in the second period to solidify his sides place in the playoff positions.

The first half was a scrappy affair with limited chances. First, Sadó Djaló saw a shot deflected wide before there were shouts of a penalty down the other end which the referee waved away. The best chance of the half came to Djaló. The frontman held off a defender to bring down a looping ball, but his poke goalward was acrobatically turned over by the Clee keeper Tom Jackson to keep the sides level as they entered the break.

The second half followed a similar picture to the first, with limited chances for either side. Michael Pearson made a crucial block to get in the way of a Brody Robertson shot early on, before full back Shrimpton missed a golden opportunity, skewing an effort wide from six yards out. On 70 minutes however, the away side found a breakthrough. Robertson bought down a flick on in the Dunston box and slid the ball into the net from three yards out. Just six minutes later, Clee asserted their dominance on the scoreline by adding a second, Robertson on hand again– capitalising on a misplaced Liam Connell clearance, charging into the box and slotting the ball home to give his side all three points.

Dunston will look to bounce back on Tuesday night as they face Sheffield FC at the UTS Stadium.

INTERVIEW | Jack Camarda

Many of you may have noticed a new name cropping up on the teamsheets over the past few weeks by the name of Jack Camarda. We sat down with our newest recruit to discuss his junior footballing career and his time at the UTS Stadium so far.



Q: Jack, how have you found your first few weeks at Dunston?

JC: It has been brilliant; I feel like I have fitted in well with the lads and they have made me feel really welcome – especially as I have come in mid-season and I am one of the youngest of the squad. Getting to know Swaz, Jon and the rest of the backroom staff on a more personal basis and what style of

football they like to play – and their ambitions! The people involved in the background have also been really welcoming and I'd like to thank all of those who have welcomed and introduced themselves to me during my first weeks.

Q: What's your career been like to date, and why do you feel Dunston is the right place to move your career forward?

JC: I have had a positive career so far in my opinion. During my younger years I spent time at Oldham and Mansfield Town, before landing a 2 year academy deal at Fleetwood Town. Sadly, after not being given a new deal, I got myself into Preston North End's development squad for 2 years.

I spent time at Clitheroe on loan, but after having my time there cut short due to Covid-19, I moved back home to the Isle of Man. Here, I spent time with FC Isle of Man, where I played a key role in midfield helping the club to get promoted and win a cup in our first season in English Football.

Q: FC Isle of Man are a unique team, and there must be lots of travelling involved – what was your experience like there?

JC: My time at FC IOM will stick with me for the rest of my career. We played a Play-Off Semi Final and Final at our home ground, and both sold out with 4000 people there. To play in front of that sort of crowd at the age of 20 was an unbelievable experience.



The travelling is very intense I have to admit. Saturday would be a day trip so we'd have to fly on the Saturday morning and then back after the game, but midweek games are a massive commitment for players. You'd have to fly out Tuesday afternoon which would mean most lads would have to take a half day at work, and then stay in a hotel overnight before flying back first thing in the morning and then heading straight to work. It's a tiring process but it's something every player from back home wants to be a part of. All the lads did it for the love of the game.

Q: For those that have not seen you play yet, could you give us a feel of the type of player that you are and what you hope you can bring to the team?

JC: I'm a defensive midfielder firstly. I like to dictate play, get on the ball and also break up play. My biggest attribute to my game is my range of passing and vision 100%. I also think a big part of my game is my defending. Breaking up play, intercepting passes and starting attacks from this is something I think I can bring to the squad. I do have a keen eye for goal, especially anything within 25 yards. Hopefully, I can bring all of these key attributes to the team and help us push for promotion this season.

Q: You grabbed your first Dunston goal on Monday night against Chester-Le-Street Town, and put in a man of the match performance too – what did you make of Tuesday's victory

JC: Monday was a big moment for me. Since joining my minutes have been limited and I have had to be patient, but getting MOTM and grabbing a goal are a big step in the right direction to hopefully push for a starting role.
