Club history

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium. Hello The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor.

With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back Northern League doubles in 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and continue to be some to this day.

At the start of the 2008/2009 season UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor.

The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C, the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

Arguably one of Dunston UTS FC's greatest achievements came in The FA Vase Final of 2012. In front of a crowd of 5,126 at Wembley Stadium, under the guidance of then Manager Billy Irwin, an Andrew Bulford brace ensured a 2-0 victory over Northern League rivals West Auckland Town.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

Lincoln United FC

Club History



Founded in 1938, Lincoln United Football Club were formally known as Lincoln Amateurs, playing in the Lincoln League. In 1950 the club signed its first semi-professional player (on 5 shillings a week, 25p in today's money!) at which point the club was re-named to Lincoln United aka 'The Whites'.

The club won its first honours in the 1963-64 season with the Lincolnshire League Championship and the Lincolnshire Senior B Cup. Over the years the club has won honours in various leagues, as they have progressed and grown in the football pyramid, securing three promotions in 3 years, in the late 80's, under the great John Wilkinson.

Throughout its history, Lincoln United has been a major force in the city of Lincoln football scene, as well as playing a huge part within the local community. It is down to the efforts of many officials, players, volunteers, and sponsors over the years that the club has been shaped into what it is today.

In 2020 the club started a new chapter in the club's history, with the appointment of a new Executive Board, that has since steered the club to financial sustainability. Delivering significant stadium investment and unprecedented growth. Lincoln United FC now boast 32 teams across all sections of the club: Men's and Women's 1st teams, Men's, and Women's development teams and 28 junior teams (boys and girls). In addition, Lincoln United is now offering a fantastic new educational and recreational services; with a B-Tech academy for 16–18-year-olds partnering with Lincoln College, Mini-Whites for 4- & 5-year-olds, Wildcats for girls 5-11 and Lincs Ladies Play, a successful recreational offer promoting opportunity for women to play in a relaxed setting.

The new state-of-the-art sprinkler pitch irrigation system, new floodlights, new branding/signage and other cosmetic and safety improvements has seen Ashby Avenue shake off its tired look, with future improvement still to come.

Sam Wilkinson (Manager) – Sam is back as the manager of Lincoln United for a second stint under the new board, officially being appointed in the summer prior to the 2020-21 season after leaving the club midway through the 2018-19 season. Sam also played for ‘The Whites’ where he racked up over 200 appearances and 50+ goals as a big target-man striker.

Stuart Reddington (Assistant Manager) – ‘Redders’ has followed a similar pathway to Sam and is back as the men’s first team Assistant Manager for the second time, returning with Sam in the summer period prior to 2020-21 season. ‘Redders’, similarly, to Sam is a ‘Whites’ legend for his playing days too, having started at United as a youngster before being transferred into professional football. Stuart would end his career at Ashby Avenue, returning to make 200+ appearances.

George Zuerner (Player/Coach) – George returns to Lincoln United, albeit in a different role, after some time away from the club, having originally started his non-league career at United under the forever-loved, John Wilkinson. George will add some experience within the midfield as well as in the dressing room.

James Morgan (GK Coach) – A great member of the coaching team who joined the club upon Sam Wilkinson’s official appointment prior to the 2020-21 season. Under Morgs’ coaching, United have seen last season’s number 1, Michal Antkowiak, transfer across to Poland and play professional football.

Martin Burnett (Coach) – Martin has been part of Lincoln United in many different forms for 30+ years. Martin re-joins the men’s first team coaching staff in-line with Sam’s return as the men’s first team manager. Martin was an integral part of the 2020-21 U17s coaching staff which saw the team win the league and cup double.

Tom Phillips (Sports Therapist) – Tom joined the club prior to the 2020-21 season. A fully qualified BSc Sports Therapist with additional qualification; FA Level 1 Introduction to First Aid and Trauma Management within sport.

Jack Johnson (Assistant Kitman) – Jack has been with the club for many years now and is an ever present at training and matches, giving the players and management vital support with ensuring all kit and equipment needs are met.

Ellis Spencer (Goalkeeper) – Another young keeper who has joined the club during the summer from local club, Lincoln Moorlands Railway. Ellis has impressed in pre-season and will be looking to establish himself at this level of football.

Ross Woolley (Goalkeeper) – A young keeper who was previously a YT at Lincoln City. Ross played for the club on loan in Sam Wilkinson's first game back as manager, in fact the ultimate game in the '19-20 season before the Covid-19 pandemic. Jack Arbon (Defender) – A young 18yr old who has joined the club during the summer straight from Collingham U18s. Jack has impressed hugely in pre-season and has played a high proportion of pre-season matches; we look forward to watching him grow as a player throughout this season.

Max Baker (Defender) – A product of our youth system and joins the squad straight from last season's U18s. A fantastic young player who has great work ethic and quality to match; Max, similarly to Jack, has impressed hugely in pre-season and we're certain he'll make a positive impact this season.

Simon Biggs (Defender) – 'Biggsy' joined the club when Sam Wilkinson was announced, following Wilkinson from Hykeham Town. Able to play centrally or a right-back, 'Biggsy' cemented himself as the team's right-back during the 20-21 season but upon returning to football between March – May, 'Biggsy' suffered a snapped achilles and so we hope he'll return around October 2021.

Callum Foster (Defender) – Originally a product of the club's youth system, 'Fozzy' returned to the club last summer after a brief, yet successful spell at Winterton Rangers. A storming start to the 2020-21 season saw 'Fozzy' become a 'must-have' on the pitch and as such is now United's vice-captain.

Archie Moyses (Defender) – Son of ex-Lincoln City Manager, Chris Moyses, Archie joins the club this summer after impressing at other clubs such as Spalding United and Pinchbeck United. After an injury kept Archie out of pre-season, we look forward to seeing him play during the season.

Josh Nichol (Defender) – Josh returns to the club this summer after a spell away from Ashby Avenue, in the main, spent at Skegness United. Josh brings a wealth of experience to the pitch and changing room, as well as being able to play in numerous positions, we hope Josh will be key to supporting our young team.

Owen Sheriff (Defender) – A young, strong, and physically able 17yr old who made his debut in pre-season and has a big future for the club.

Tristan Skerritt (Defender) – After trialling at the club throughout the summer, Tristan, has impressed at both centre-back and right-back with his calmness with and without the ball, as well as his fantastic attributes. A very good player, only 19, one we hope will thrive at the club.

Kallum Smith (Defender) – United's most experienced player with over 400+ appearances, as well as having spells at both Grantham Town and Boston United. A versatile player who started as a winger but through his ability to make the right decisions and his quality of passing has found himself as a full-back. Kallum's will-to-win, work ethic and all-round quality makes him a key player on and off the pitch.

Clayton Wilkinson (Defender) – Having come through United's youth system and last campaign was the development team's captain, 'Clayts' has played several games for the first team during pre-season. Can play at right-back or centre midfield and like many others, will no doubt have a bright future for 'The Whites'.

Matt Cotton (Midfield) – Returned to the club last summer, aligned with Wilkinson’s return. ‘Cotts’ has fantastic ability on the ball, which is equally matched by his work rate off the ball. Tobias Liversidge (Midfield) – An ex-Lincoln City YT, joins the club after playing for Spalding United last season. An industrious wide man who has plenty of quality on the ball, can chip in with goals and assists, of which we saw regularly throughout pre-season.

Harry Millard (Midfield) – Harry has been at the club for some time now and is probably well known to NPL opponents and referees. Not afraid to ‘mix-it’ and has great quality in supporting United to get on the attack. A great character on and off the pitch and is pivotal to this young ‘Whites’ side.

Player interview



Michael Pearson is a strong, solid and composed midfielder who can play in a number of positions across the midfield. He has vast experience in the game, with spells at Hartlepool United, Blyth Spartans and South Shields, and joined the club from Consett AFC. Having played over 100 games for Dunston, and has captained the side on numerous occasions this season, and is a hugely respected member of the dressing room. You've also taken the captains armband on a number of occasions this season, what do you think it takes to captain a side effectively and have you enjoyed leading Dunston when asked to?

For me personally I always try and lead by example on the pitch, it's not my personality to be the loudest player in the dressing room so I try to encourage people and give my best on the pitch and hopefully people see the effort I put in and do the same.

Although still a while to go, what are your hopes for the second half of the season as we get towards the Christmas period?

I think we can kick on even further in the second half of the season, everyone knows we didn't have the best start but the way we have turned it round over the last few weeks just shows we can beat any team in this league and I'm confident that we will continue to climb the table.
