Club history

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium. Hello The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor.

With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back Northern League doubles in 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and continue to be some to this day.

At the start of the 2008/2009 season UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor.

The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C, the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

Arguably one of Dunston UTS FC's greatest achievements came in The FA Vase Final of 2012. In front of a crowd of 5,126 at Wembley Stadium, under the guidance of then Manager Billy Irwin, an Andrew Bulford brace ensured a 2-0 victory over Northern League rivals West Auckland Town.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.



MARSKE UNITED FC HISTORY

The club was established in 1956 by members of Marske Cricket Club and initially played in the Cleveland League and then the South Bank League before moving up to the Teesside League in 1976. The Seasideers won both the Teesside League and the North Riding County Cup in 1980–81 and were league champions again in 1984–85, after which the club moved up to the Wearside League. The following season saw the club win the North Riding County Cup for a second time.



Marske were runners-up in the Wearside League in 1993–94 and 1994–95, a season that also saw them win the North Riding Senior Cup and the League Cup. They went on to win the Wearside League title in 1995–96, as well as retaining the League Cup. After finishing as runners-up again in 1996–97, the club were promoted to Division Two of the Northern League.

In their first season in Division Two they finished third and were promoted to Division One. The club were relegated back to Division Two at the end of the 2003–04 season but were promoted to Division One in 2010–11 after finishing third. They won the League Cup in 2013–14 beating Whitley Bay 2-1 after extra time in a game played at St James' Park to celebrate 125 years of the Northern League and were Northern League champions the following season though promotion wasn't taken as the club had not applied. Division One runners-up in 2015–16, in 2017–18 they reached the semi-finals of the FA Vase for the first time in their history, losing 3–2 on aggregate to Stockton Town. The 2017–18 season saw Marske win the Division One title again, earning promotion to Division One East of the Northern Premier League and to Step 4 of the Non-League System for the first time in their history. Their first season at a higher level saw the club consolidate, finishing in 10th place as well as reaching the quarter-finals of the Integro League Cup, where they lost on penalties to Buxton. They also reached the final of the North Riding Senior Cup, where they lost on penalties to fellow Northern Premier League team Scarborough Athletic, following a 2-2 draw after 90 minutes. When the 2019/20 was curtailed, Marske were sitting in 5th place, their highest ever placing within the Non-League System, and looked set for the play-offs. Season 2020/21 was yet another truncated season, but it wasn't without success for the club on the Cup front. In August 2020, Marske won the North Riding Senior Cup for only the second time in their history, beating Thornaby 6-0 in the final. In the FA Cup, Marske reached the 4th Qualifying Round for the second time in their history, eventually losing to Brackley Town 5-1. In the process of reaching the final qualifying round, the Seasideers kept 5 clean sheets in a row. In the FA Trophy, Marske beat NPL Premier Division sides FC United of Manchester and Warrington Town, before losing to Spennymoor Town, a run that equalled their best ever performance in the competition.

Player Profiles



Ryan Catterick - Catterick a recent signing from Hartlepool United. A highly rated, youthful keeper who started his career at Middlesbrough FC and spent time on loan at Northern League Guisborough Town. Ryan kept 5 consecutive clean sheets in our path to the FA Cup 4th Qualifying Round last season.

Liam Watson - Liam is also the club's goalkeeper coach and provides back up to Ryan Catterick. Liam made one appearance for the club last in season 2019/20, coming on as a substitute in the 9th minute of the North Riding Senior Cup quarter final vs Middlesbrough, keeping a clean sheet.

Andrew May -Andrew was signed at the start of the 2018/19 season from Whitby Town. He's a skilful player who is extremely comfortable on the ball and is comfortable playing as a centre back or right back. As well as Whitby, Andrew also played for near neighbours Guisborough Town and was selected to appear for Jamie Vardy's V9 Academy.

Connor Smith - Right sided defender Connor joins the Seaside from Northern League side Whitley Bay. Prior to that, Connor started his career at Hartlepool United, where he made 15 appearances and also spent time on loan at Whitby Town. After his release by Hartlepool, he has played for York City and Frickley Athletic and was part of the Frickley team that did the double over Marske in the 2018/19 season.

Liam O'Sullivan Liam is in his second spell at the club after having a 6-month stay at neighbours Billingham Synthonia. He is a skilful and pacey left back, who can also play on the left hand side of the centre of defence, and possesses one of the best long throws in the League. Liam was fundamental in both of our previous league title wins. He has previously played for Guisborough Town and Dunston.

Glen Butterworth - Glen is an absolutely key player in the Marske United midfield. He has an eye for goal, averaging double figures for the season, and was the winner of the FA Trophy goal of the round for his superb free kick against Stocksbridge Park Steels. He is a senior player with vast amounts of experience, having played over 300 games for the club. His previous clubs include Guisborough town and Billingham Town.

Adam Wheatley - Captain Adam is the club's longest serving player. A stalwart central defender who won Supporter's and Player's Player of the season in the last completed season. He was included in the 2018/19 Northern Premier League Division 1 East Team of the Season last season. Wheatley leads by example and is in his 12th season at the club. Signed from Stokesley, he has made over 400 appearances for the club.

Shahban Mohammed - Combative midfielder Shahban is a recent signing for Marske United, having previously played for Stockton Town and Morpeth Town. Shahban made his debut in the recent victory over Worksop Town and also came on early as a substitute in the FA Trophy victory vs FC United of Manchester in the last round.

Kevin Burgess - Kev's youth career was with Middlesbrough FC. Since 2007 he has played for and captained Darlington FC and Whitby Town and was most recently with Scarborough Athletic. The robust, no nonsense defender brings a wealth of experience from a higher level.

Craig Gott - in his second spell at the club having had a spell at higher league Spennymoor. Craig has played nearly 300 games for the Seaside, scoring 99 goals. Craig is rated as one of the best midfielders in North-East non-league football and has also played for Darlington.

Curtis Round - a pacey winger with an eye for goal playing a key part in the 2017/18 Northern League title winning team. In the 2018/19 season Curtis was top scorer with 18 goals in 33 games and he also finished in 2nd place in the unofficial Northern Premier League player of the season vote. His former clubs include Redcar Town, Guisborough Town and Whitby Town.

David McTiernan - Macca has a wealth of experience having previously played for Blyth Spartans and, most recently, Whitby Town. The midfielder was also recently part of the management at Whitby Town and becomes a player-coach at Marske.

Dale Hopson - Dale is another player with vast experience at a higher level, having played for Whitby Town and Blyth Spartans. Dale is a skilful midfielder with an eye for a pass and has already impressed in pre-season. Has also played for Darlington, Huddersfield Town and Thornaby as well as spending time playing in Sweden.

Jack Blackford - Blackford is a hard-working attack minded midfielder with an eye for goal. He has previously played for Hartlepool United and Whitby Town. Jack has also had trials at Manchester City, Rangers and Aston Villa.

Adam Boyes - Adam is arguably the club's biggest ever signing, having played most recently for National League North side Spennymoor Town. The former pro forward has only ever played in the top two divisions of non-league and has experience with York City, Kidderminster Harriers, Bradford Park Avenue and Barrow. Boyes becomes the first Marske United player ever to have played for the England C Team making appearances against Italy, Gibraltar and Malta u23s sides.

Matthew Tymon - Signed in the summer of 2020, Tymon joins us from local rivals Whitby Town. The physical striker started his career off at Hartlepool United before later going onto play for Workington AFC and Whitby Town. He adds a big threat upfront for Marske and valuable experience in our push for promotion. Tymon was also named in the top 50 players to play in the Northern League since its inception in 1968. In a truncated 2020/21 season, Matty managed to score 13 goals including 7 goals in 5 League games.

James Fairley - James is now in his third spell at Marske United and counts Whitby Town, Bishop Auckland and Sunderland RCA among his former clubs. James is a tricky winger renowned for scoring some sensational goals, which includes a long range free kick for Marske against Shildon, which was viewed over 30,000 times on social media.

Billy Clark - Billy is the son of Marske United Head Coach Ian Clark and has been a member of the squad for the last 2 seasons. Comfortable playing wide midfield or up front, Billy has made the step up from junior football, having played for Norton & Stockton.

Dunston UTS FC Manager Chris Swailes speaks candidly about the clubs season so far, his sides recent form and what he's doing to get this season back on track.

Given the clubs current run of form, is this one of the most challenging periods in your time as Dunston manager?

I didn't expect that when we got promotion it would all be a bed of roses, however I did expect us to be doing better what we are, but then at the same time, I didn't expect the League to be as tough as what it is.

When the league changed and the likes of Clitheroe, Colne, Marine, Ramsbottom and Workington moved to The West Division, I think we expected this league to be a lot easier, but we've not found this League easy.

It's surprised us and it's surprised a lot of people. We've gone from being in the play-off places, 4 points ahead of the teams below, and now to find ourselves 10 points out of the play-offs, it's really disappointing, especially with the turn of the year coming.

When we won 6 games off the spin during September and October, I expected us to cement our play-off position, but in recent weeks, and with Sado leaving, our form's coincided with that. I'm not saying that that's the main reason, but it has stemmed from that, so at the moment it is very disappointing.

At the start of the season you'd set objectives of being in the play-offs come the end of the season. How has the teams recent run of form impacted on the season's objectives?

It's had a massive impact and it makes you look the fool if I'm being totally honest. I never want to make predictions of where you're going to be at the end of the season, but with the squad that we had at the start we felt confident for the season ahead.

In the last few weeks, defensively as a team, I really think we've been exposed. We always look like scoring and I think that shows; we've scored in 17 games on the spin, but we cannot keep a clean sheet and we're being punished for mistakes.

Looking at the table, there's a lot of work to do. We've got to roll our sleeves up, hopefully we can get a few more signings in and look towards getting back into the play-offs places.

With half of the season still to be played, do you think that those objectives are still achievable?

Yes I definitely do, we're turning this situation around. We've got a difficult game on Saturday, then we've got the teams to play the second time round and hopefully we do better with these games ahead. There's a lot of points to be played for. Nothing changes, I still want us to, and I still expect us to get in there.

You mentioned about bringing players into the club to improve things. As a management team, how challenging is it at the moment to bring the right players into the club?

People might think you just go from game to game, but in between training sessions, I'm constantly on the phone speaking to other Manager's trying to get players in and it's hard. We want players from a level above who are going to improve the side and it's not easy getting those players in. We're then having to look at players who are either on the same level as us, or are playing below our level, but are capable of playing at this level, and nobody wants to release these types of players.

I speak to the clubs surrounding us and sometimes you're banging your head against a brick wall, but we're doing all we can to get players in. I'm in talks with a player this week so hopefully we can that one over the line, but it's a lot harder than you think. Some people might think that if you like a player you can just go out and get him, but there'll be a lot of clubs looking at the same player. Some might not want to drop down a level; often players in The Northern League don't want to travel, and when you're bringing players in from levels below, you've got to be looking for players who have ambition, who want to challenge themselves and who can commit.

You brought players in and added to your backroom staff way ahead of the season starting. As a team you were set up strongly before a ball was kicked. Now as the season's gone on you've had players ask for transfers, or who've decided to not continue playing, so you've had to re-adjust as the seasons developed. How has that impacted your initial plans?

Sado went because he wanted to play at a higher level, he was unwilling to sign a contract at Dunston in the first place. He done brilliantly well for us in the time he was here, but he's not getting at look in at Blyth Spartans currently.

Scott Heslop had asked for a transfer, I couldn't guarantee him games because Sado was doing that well at the time. You can't drop a player who has scored 8 goals in 10 games as we were flying at the time. For me to have dropped Sado would've been stupid. When opportunities come for players to play, that player has to make the most of those chances.

No one wanted Scott or Sado to leave the club and the best efforts were made to convince them to stay, but if a player is not on contract and he insists on leaving the club, for whatever reason, the club is powerless in retaining that player.

We're still working hard trying improve things all over the pitch and I'm fully aware of where those improvements need to be made.

This season has seen impressive increase in attendances, we're averaging three hundred plus every game. Our Supporters have turned out in numbers at away games and the support the team have received this season has been tremendous. What message do you have for Dunston's Supporters?

It's a close run club and we know all the supporters individually, we massively appreciated the fans coming in and giving their support, especially when things aren't going well. We need them on board and we're going to turn things around we just need their support and hopefully with the support we get, it goes hand in hand with results. Keep on supporting us because things will hopefully change for the better.
