Club history

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium. Hello The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor.

With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back Northern League doubles in 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and continue to be some to this day.

At the start of the 2008/2009 season UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor.

The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C, the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

Arguably one of Dunston UTS FC's greatest achievements came in The FA Vase Final of 2012. In front of a crowd of 5,126 at Wembley Stadium, under the guidance of then Manager Billy Irwin, an Andrew Bulford brace ensured a 2-0 victory over Northern League rivals West Auckland Town.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East



- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Ossett United Club history


The Formation of Ossett United

Ossett United was created on the 1st June 2018 following the merger of Ossett Town AFC (est. 1936) and Ossett Albion AFC (est. 1944). Both Ossett Town and Ossett Albion had managed to gain Northern Premier League status and maintain that level of football for a remarkable period of time.

Early History

The two clubs merged under the leadership of a new board brought together from the two previous clubs. The founding directors were John Chidlaw (OA), James Rogers (OT), Emma Chidlaw(OA), Dawn Rogers (OT), Lee Summerscales (OA) and Lee Broadbent (OT) forming the new Board with support from Phil Smith as CEO. John Chidlaw took on the role of Chairman for the first season. The Club made its new home Ingfield, the previous home of Ossett Town, and used Dimple Wells, the previous home of Ossett Albion, as its Ladies and Academy Team base.

On the pitch, the first year (2018/19) was a remarkable success with attendances significantly increased from what either club had experienced previously, coupled with success on the pitch reaching the play-off semi-final and winning the County Cup, under the guidance of manager Andy Welsh. Off the pitch things were not as successful with a number of resignations and board changes and some challenging financial issues to deal with following the merger. By the end of the 2018/19 season, Phil Smith had taken on the mantle of club chairman following a number of board changes.



Wayne Benn took up the managerial reins in late 2019 following a poor start to the 2019/20 season, however, that season was ended abruptly in March 2020 with the onset of a global pandemic known as Covid 19. The season was null and voided. Off the pitch there were more troubles for Ossett United in November 2019 as a significant and unprecedented court case, dating back to a tackle in 2015 when Ossett Town were playing Radcliffe Borough, was lost with United facing legal and damages costs amounting to £135,000. Fortunately, the club received a generous loan from two of its closest supporters to avoid the club going into liquidation (at worst) or selling the Ingfield ground (at best).

The start of the 2020/21 season started late due to the ongoing pandemic and virtually finished as soon as it had started with only eight league games having been played by United. This time the season was curtailed rather than null and voided and meant a second season had gone unfinished. Off the pitch Rogers and Smith swapped roles due to Smith's work commitments and Rogers took on the role as Chairman, a role he had previously held at Ossett Town. 2020 also saw the club declare Dimple Wells as surplus to requirements and made arrangements to surrender the lease making Ingfield the single home of the united club.

Wayne Benn – Manager

'Benno' was appointed first team manager in November 2019 following a long and successful period in charge of NCEL side Hemsworth Miners Welfare where he built a loyal and talented squad taking them from the lower reaches of the First Division to genuine promotion contender in the Premier Division. As a player he is best known for his time at Bradford Park Avenue, making over 400 appearances.

Andy Hayward – Assistant Manager

Andy 'Chick' Hayward turned professional in 1994 playing over 120 games for Rotherham United, winning the 1996 Football League Trophy. He played over 50 games for Ossett Town at the end of his career scoring 32 times. Chick has been part of 'Benno's' management team for a number of years and plays a key role in ensuring the squad is a tight knit unit.

Katie Davies – Sports Therapist

Graduated from Leeds Beckett University with BSc Hons in Sport and Exercise Therapy. Katie is also qualified in Intermediate Trauma Medical Management in Football and First Aid at Work. Her past experiences include two seasons with Hemsworth MWFC and a season with the County FA representatives U18s team. Katie has also had placements with Sheffield United and other sports teams during her time at University

Emily Crispin – Sports Therapist

Emily graduated from Leeds Beckett University with a BSc Honours in Sport and Exercise Therapy. She qualified in first aid at work and trauma management within sport.

Mark Smith – First Team Coach

Smith has 510 league appearances spread over a 17 years playing career for teams such as Sheffield Wednesday, Barnsley, Chesterfield and Huddersfield. He has coached at Lincoln City, Notts County and Barnsley before taking the academy role at Barnsley where he took them to the FA Youth Cup semi-final of 2001/02 and FA Premier League 2 runners up in 2002/03. He has also held the position of academy manager at Sheffield Wednesday, taking charge of the first team as caretaker manager in 2004. Currently he holds the position of loans Manager at Sheffield United

Jay Mellor – Goalkeeper Coach

A UEFA B Licensed goalkeeper coach. As a player he left Barnsley School Boys at 16 to join Rotherham United on a YTS but a broken ankle put pay to that dream. At 19 Jay travelled America becoming a coach at Stetson University in Florida. Before joining Ossett United last season, he was academy coach for several clubs including Barnsley, Sheffield Wednesday and Leeds United

Jack Cowgill – Defender

A former academy graduate at Barnsley, Cowgill made his EFL debut in 2014 for them against Walsall. He then had loan spells at Braintree and Fylde before signing for Boston United. Cowgill had a spell out of the game before signing for Nostell Miners Welfare where he re-discovered his love for the game. A very talented defender with a big future ahead and a key player in Wayne Benn's plans.

Max Dearnley – Goalkeeper

Former Halifax Town and Scarborough Athletic player, Max joined in the summer of 2020 from Penistone Church. The tall shot stopper impressed last season and will be looking to raise his profile further with another good season between the sticks

Eddie Cass – Defender

Strong in the tackle and in the air and a real leader. Cass will add some steel at the heart of defence. Cass had a spell in America where he played for Rocky Mountain Collage winning the defender of the year award and was a key player for Hemsworth Miners Welfare before moving to Ingfield

Cameron Clark – Defender

Signed from Belper Town where he was highly thought of by their manager, he is a pacey full back who defends well and will also get forward to support the attack, equally adept at the centre of defence where he was used last season.

Harry Gagen – Defender

Full back Harry Gagen signed for Ossett United last season after a loan spell in 19/20 that was cut short as the season was null and voided. Gagen looked to make the right back spot his own before 20/21 was curtailed.

Ross Hardaker – Defender

Ossett based Hardaker is very popular with players and supporters alike, he played for both Albion and Town and bleeds Ossett – which you may see as he always puts his body on the line for his club. The cultured full back is a key member of the squad.

Ross Killock – Defender

Killock started his career at Leeds United and spent time on loan at Chester and Halifax Town. He has played for Stalybridge Celtic, Scarborough Athletic and joins us from AFC Mansfield. Killock will add quality to the Ossett United back line.

Marcel Chipamaunga – Midfielder

Marcel started at Rossington Main before moving to Boston Utd and spending time in their under 21's. He has also spent time at Spalding United and a spell at Boston Town, prior to joining us. Marcel dual registered with Athersley Recreation to get much needed game time after a disrupted start to the season.

George Green – Midfielder

A former England U17 International, Green moved from Bradford City to Everton for an initial £300,000. George also player in Scotland and Norway. George is local to Ossett and ready to concentrate on his football. He will definitely be one to watch this season.

Luke Hogg – Midfielder

A hard working and tenacious midfielder of considerable potential. Luke started his career in the very successful Guiseley Academy where he spent loan spells with Grantham and North Ferriby in the NPL. Other former clubs include Frickley and Hemsworth MWFC

Mitch Levi-Lewis

Talented forward player, excellent on the ball with a great pass and shot as well as tremendous vision, Levi-Lewis will be looking to establish himself in the side this season.

Nash Connolly – Forward

Talented winger with an eye for a goal, Connolly has plied his trade in the NCEL for a number of years with great affect. Another player who stayed loyal to his former club when NPL offer had come in. Connolly settled into the side well last season and will look to impress further this year.

Aaron Haswell – Forward

James Walshaw – Forward

'Wally' has returned to Ingfield, where he started his career at Ossett Town. The forward has had an illustrious semi-professional career playing for the likes of Guiseley, Harrogate Town, Halifax Town, Altrincham, Scarborough Athletic and most recently Buxton in the curtailed 20/21 season. The confident forward knows where the goal is and will be looking to add to his already impressive career total.
