Club history

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium. Hello The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor.

With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back Northern League doubles in 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and continue to be some to this day.

At the start of the 2008/2009 season UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor.

The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C, the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

Arguably one of Dunston UTS FC's greatest achievements came in The FA Vase Final of 2012. In front of a crowd of 5,126 at Wembley Stadium, under the guidance of then Manager Billy Irwin, an Andrew Bulford brace ensured a 2-0 victory over Northern League rivals West Auckland Town.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East

MATTY PATTISON

Player interview

Matty Pattison arrived at The UTS Stadium earlier in the season with a fine footballing CV and made an instant impact. Having played at the highest level of the game, he started his professional footballing career at Newcastle United and has been capped at International 5 times by South Africa.



The 34 year old had appeared for Norwich City, top South African sides Mamelodi Sundowns and Bidvest Vits, before returning to the North East in 2014.

Since then, he has starred for Gateshead, Blyth Spartans and South Shields before joining near neighbours Whickham as Player/Manager. He currently coaches Gateshead FC's Under 19's side.

Since losing away to Stockton Town, results have improved considerably, with Dunston now on a five game winning streak. What is behind the upturn in performance?

I think it was always going to take a bit of time to get some consistency with a lot of new faces this season, so I think that showed early on. Since the big man (Sadó Djaló) has come in upfront he's made a huge difference I think.

It definitely seems that his signing has made a huge difference. Since he arrived at the club, the team have won their last five games in succession. The dressing room must be buzzing at the moment.

For sure, he works his socks off up top and holds the ball up well. The lads are over the moon with the recent run of form. The result mid-week away to Worksop Town was a big win and has certainly given us more confidence going into Saturday's game.

Would you say the Worksop Town performance was the best the team have played so far this season?

I think so, it's certainly up there along with the Frickley game.

You arrived at Dunston this season, and you seem to have fitted straight into the club. How have you found things so far?

Yeah it's been great, they're all good lads, coaching staff and there's a lot of good people involved with the club, so it's been very easy to slot in.

Currently you're involved in Gateshead FC's Academy. Prior to that, and before signing for Dunston, you were up the road with Whickham as Player/Manager. Are the skills you've learned in those roles something you've been able to bring into the dressing-room at Dunston?

Yeah, I'm sure it helps, certainly with the younger players. I've had a lot of experiences throughout my career, that I'm sure in some way, can help to have a positive effect on other players in the dressing room.

You mention experience, you've played at the highest levels of the game. During your time, and in your opinion, who are some of the best players you've played alongside and had to face?

I think the likes of Alan Shearer, Michael Owen and Nobby Solano were the best I've played with for different reasons; the first two were brilliant finishers and Owen was very clever with his movement and runs. Nobby Solano was really intelligent and made the game look easy, so good technically, which is the side of the game I enjoy. Players I've played against, I would have to say Rooney and Ronaldo. Rooney just ran games, he could go in behind or drop deep and dictate play, where Ronaldo had everything pace, power, technique and both were top finishers.

How did your signing for Dunston happen?

I'd spoken to Swaz, asked to come in and train, as I had been speaking to him about Eddie Thomas who was in from Gateshead, so I just came along and it went from there really.

Is it good to be back playing without the additional duties of managing?

Yeah I'm enjoying it and being involved with the dressing room banter again. I'm enjoying the playing side again as it is a lot different from management.



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

YORKSHIRE AMATEUR AFC CLUB HISTORY

The club was established by Kolin Robertson in November 1918. They were founder members of the Yorkshire League in 1920 but left after four seasons.

The club originally played at Elland Road, which had become available after Leeds City folded. However, in 1920 they sold the lease on the ground to Leeds United for £250. After two years playing at several different grounds, including a groundshare with Harrogate Town, the club relocated to Bracken Edge in 1922 where they remain to this day.

The club returned to the league in 1930 and were runners-up in Section B of the Subsidiary Competition in 1930–31, also winning the West Riding Challenge Cup. The following season saw them reach the first round of the FA Cup for the first time, losing 3–1 at home to Third Division North side Carlisle United. They also reached the semi-finals of the FA Amateur Cup, losing 2–1 to Marine at Filbert Street, and won the league's Second Competition, before losing to First Competition winners Huddersfield Town 'A' in a championship decider. In 1932–33 they won the league's inaugural League Cup, before winning the West Riding Challenge Cup again in 1933–34 and 1944–45.

Another FA Cup first round appearance in 1945–46 ended with a 5–2 aggregate defeat to Lincoln City of the Third Division North, with Yorkshire Amateur having led 1–0 from the first leg. The Yorkshire League gained a second division in 1950, with the club became members of Division One. They were relegated to Division Two at the end of the 1951–52 season but were Division Two runners-up the following season and were promoted back to Division One at the first attempt. After winning the West Riding County Cup in 1953–54, in 1955–56 the club were relegated to Division Two again, remaining there until winning the division in 1958–59, earning promotion back to Division One. They won the County Cup again in 1960–61, but another relegation from Division One in 1962–63 was followed by nine seasons in Division Two, before they finished as runners-up in 1971–72, a season that also saw them win the County Cup and were promoted to Division One.



Yorkshire Amateur finished bottom of Division One in 1974–75, resulting in relegation to Division Two. At the end of the 1976–77 season the club were relegated to Division Three. The following season saw them win the Division Three title at the first attempt, earning promotion back to Division Two. In 1982 the league merged with the Midland League to form the Northern Counties East League, with Yorkshire Amateur placed in Division Two North. A third-place finish in the division in 1983–84 saw them placed in Division One North amidst league reorganisation. Further league restructuring the following year led to the club becoming members of Division Three.

Division Three was abolished in 1986, with Yorkshire Amateur moved up to Division Two. Division Two was subsequently disbanded in 1991, leading to the club moving up to Division One. They were winners of the league's Wilkinson Sword Trophy in 1998–99, and remained in Division One until finishing as runners-up in 2017–18, which earned them promotion to the Premier Division under the helm of current managers Neil Sibson and Craig Ogilvie. After the 2020–21 season was curtailed due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the club were promoted to the East Division of the Northern Premier League.

Match report by Billy Montague.

Dunston made the long mid-week trip to Nottinghamshire to face a much-fancied Worksop Town FC on their impressive new 3G Pitch at the Windsor Food Services Stadium. An early departure from Dunston saw the Team Coach arrive in Worksop with time to spare after a very uneventful journey. Some players were forced to travel by car when they were unable to get time off work for the scheduled 3.15pm leaving time but all arrived without mishap on the way.

Just as well, because Manager Chris Swailes had a severely depleted squad to select his team from with the unavailability of Club Captain Craig Scott and keeper Liam Connell and injuries to Jack Elliott, Scott Heslop and Luke Porritt. He was boosted by the return after suspension of the influential Phil Turnbull and return to fitness of forward Lee Mason. The ever-reliable Andy Clark replaced Liam Connell "between the sticks" and Luke Porritt, though not fully fit, took a place on the bench.

"The Tigers" were able to field a very strong line-up that included recent new signings Liam Hardy (top scorer from Northern Premier Division Hyde United) and Rob Guilfoyle (on loan from National League North Club Bradford Park Avenue).

Worksop Town opened the game on the front foot but it was a confident Dunston side who seized the initiative with a good counter-attack on only 3 minutes when some clever play by Liam Thear released Sado Djalo who made ground before sending in a good shot that was deflected for an early corner. Just four minutes later the Dunston centre-forward returned the favour when his clever flick almost put Thear clear on goal but the home defence managed to scramble away the danger. Worksop replied on 11 minutes when Sam Ackroyd cut inside from the left to create a chance but his 22-yard shot sailed high and wide of Andy Clark's goal. More determined attacking from Dunston saw Lee Mason make room just outside the box for a right-foot shot that was straight at Worksop keeper Tiernan Brooks on 13 minutes and then Mason drew a much more difficult save from Brooks four minutes later as the visitors kept up the pressure. Worksop almost grabbed the lead in the 22nd minute when Liam Hardy was given the benefit of the doubt after a dubious challenge on a Dunston defender and he sprinted clear on goal but as he lined up his shot, Andy Clark came out and made a superb block to deny the burly forward. Dunston almost cashed in on their let-off three minutes later when link-up play between Michael Pearson and Sado Djalo sent in Jake Stafford but his dipping shot just cleared the Worksop bar. On 31 minutes Djalo almost broke the deadlock with a clever 30-yard snap-shot but Brooks made a fine save as the ball headed towards the top corner. Dunston continued to press and Lee Mason fired a shot past the angle on 34 minutes before Andy Clark was forced to make a good save to gather a James Baxendale effort at the foot of his post. As the game fluctuated from end-to-end at a terrific pace, it was only a matter of time before the stalemate was broken by one team or the other. On 37 minutes Dunston mounted a good attack on their left flank through Liam Thear who had switched wings. He cut inside and sent over a terrific right-foot cross to the back post where Sado Djalo looked a certain scorer but Jake Picton somehow deflected his effort for a corner. When Jake Stafford sent over his perfect delivery in the 38th minute, it reached the head of central defender Dan Capewell who made no mistake as he planted his header into the corner of the net. 0-1.

After this set-back, Worksop Town did their best to retaliate immediately and forced a corner of their own on 40 minutes but when James Baxendale sent over the flag-kick, Liam Hardy got on the end of it but couldn't direct his header on target. Dunston went looking to add to their lead and in first-half stoppage time a brilliant flick-on from the head of Sado Djalo freed Liam Thear to go one-on-one with the last defender before clipping a shot that drew an excellent save from keeper Tiernan Brooks.

The second-half began in much the same manner as the first had ended with Dunston making the early running and on 47 minutes Thear was at it again when he jinked past two defenders as he cut in from the right before hammering a low shot that Brooks kept out at his near post. Just four minutes more had elapsed when the crucial second Dunston goal arrived in bizarre circumstances when a long Andy Clark clearance was lifted over the Worksop defence by Jake Stafford who then ran through the home defence to draw Brooks out of his goal. The Dunston player then lobbed the ball over the keeper towards goal and pursued the loose ball that was heading towards the net. He was clearly fouled by Worksop midfielder Jack Broadhead who then proceeded to scoop the ball away from the goal-line with his hand. The Referee had no choice but to show a red-card to Broadhead and award a penalty to Dunston. After delaying tactics by the goalkeeper, Terry Galbraith kept his concentration before stepping up to slam the spot-kick into the corner of the net despite Brooks getting a hand to the ball. 0-2.

The double blow of losing the key midfielder and also a second goal seemed to deflate the home side and Dunston were winning most of the challenges and creating several chances to extend their lead. On 61 minutes a brilliant exchange of passes between Sado Djalo and Liam Thear resulted in the former breaking through the home defence and when he strode through on goal it was no surprise that he sold a dummy to the keeper and stroked the ball into the left corner of the net. 0-3.

From the re-start Dunston went looking for more when Michael Pearson made a surging run on the left before sending over a wicked cross towards the head of Djalo but his bullet header grazed the outside of the post when he probably should have scored. Despite their numerical disadvantage, Worksop never gave up and were fighting hard to regain some pride in the match. On 68 minutes substitute Aaron Sennett-Neilsen made a great run on their right wing before cutting inside and smashing a low shot right across the Dunston goal. Three minutes later, a powerful run by Liam Thear took him past three Worksop defenders and his shot was bound for the top corner of the net before Brooks pulled off a brilliant save to tip over. Worksop were not finished and as Dunston took their foot off the gas, they forced three corners in quick succession but were unable to add the finishing touch. In the 80th minute the home side came very close to pulling a goal back when Sennett-Neilsen sent in a scorching low shot that was brilliantly deflected away by Andy Clark and from the resulting corner fellow substitute Ben Tomlinson was desperately unlucky to see his 18-yard shot strike a post before bouncing to safety.
