We would like to extend a very warm welcome to everyone in attendance at the UTS Stadium this afternoon for this PITCHING-IN Northern Premier League East Division game.

Our opponents today are BRIDLINGTON TOWN FC who arrive at the UTS Stadium after their long journey from the East Riding of Yorkshire. The two Clubs have already met this season



when Dunston visited the excellent Queensgate Stadium for an Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round Tie at the end of August. After a typically competitive Cup game, Dunston ran out winners by 3-0 thanks to goals from Will Jenkins, Jack Elliott and Sado Djalo. As always, we received a very cordial welcome and hospitality on the day from the hosts and their magnanimous supporters.

Last season, "Brid" pulled off the double over Dunston when they came away from the UTS Stadium with a notable 2–1 victory in December. They then repeated the medicine in the final (very nervy) match of the campaign by a 3–2 margin to confirm their status in the PITCHING-IN NPL East Division. As it happened, results elsewhere meant that they were already safe!

Dunston FC will have to be at their best to overcome a spirited Bridlington Town FC side who currently lie only four points behind them in the very tight League Table. Their Team Manager Mike Thompson and his Assistant Adrian Costello have assembled a versatile and competitive playing squad who relish a battle for the points.

We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this afternoon. Referee Kieran Downey travels from Sunderland and his Assistant Referees Kieran Graham comes from Cramlington while Matthew Davidson comes from South Shields. Our FA Match Observer today is Ted Ilderton who comes from Whitley Bay.

Supporters old and new are very well appreciated and we hope you enjoy your visit to the UTS Stadium this afternoon. Dunston FC Football Club History

The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit. Long-serving Club stalwart, John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, decided to form a football team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics F.C. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being League Champions twice and League Cup Winners once – the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember

when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011–2012 when, under the Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2–0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium. The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the "Club Playing Name" must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved a bit more difficult than expected against tougher opponents in the NPL North West Division. Some promising early results were tempered by some setbacks, and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any great consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table. After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston added to the playing squad in time for the opening of the newly formed NPL East Division for the 2021-22 season. Some very good results were achieved but a

couple of disappointing runs resulted in a final sixth-place finish, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs.

Over the years the Club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with hard work behind the scenes. The efforts of the management committee and ground staff at The UTS Stadium have ensured that the ground is a credit to the Club. Many of the backroom staff at the Club have been involved since it was founded in 1975. It's a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the Club has become one of the most successful and respected on the North East non-league scene.



The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.

MATCH REPORT | COALVILLE TOWN (H)

FT: Dunston UTS 1-3 Coalville Town Goal(s): Jenkins (65') Att: 219

Dunston's ten game unbeaten run came to an end at the hands of Coalville Town on Saturday afternoon at The UTS Stadium. After a battling performance in front of the 219 in attendance, it just wasn't meant to be.

The visitors made a bright start to the contest as Tendai Chitiza fired his side into the lead after 18 minutes. Dunston responded well in the



second half and the South Shields' loanee Will Jenkins scored an equaliser for Dunston midway through the half after an excellent left-footed finish.

Unfortunately, the lead would last just a matter of minutes as Ashley Chambers put Coalville back into the lead. Chambers then went on to seal the victory for The Ravens with ten minutes to play as the striker grabbed a third for his side.

It was Coalville who certainly started the game much brighter and looked to assert their dominance early on. With less than a minute played, Tendai Chitiza found himself in half a yard of space and glanced a curling effort just wide of the post.

On four minutes, Dan Staples was called into action for the first time as he had to be switched on to keep Coalville out. The ball fell to McGlinchey on the left and he fired low and hard at Staples however, the shot-stopper was there to keep him out.

Despite the two early chances for Coalville, Dunston looked to cause problems of their own down the left through Jack Elliott. The winger swung in two good crosses inside the first ten minutes however, nobody was there to get on the end of it.

On 18 minutes, the deadlock was broken as The Ravens took the lead. A flick-on from Billy Kee, after some nice build-up play, fell to Tendai Chitiza who kept his composure and fired past Staples to put the visitors ahead.



The pressure continued to mount as Coalville continued to look dangerous in attack and they almost doubled their lead 6 minutes later. McGlinchey again causing problems and he struck the post with a low shot from just outside the box.

As the first half wore on, Dunston looked a little bit more settled and started causing problems of their own. Just

before the half-hour mark, some neat play involving Mouanda and Jenkins resulted in the ball falling to Phil Turnbull on the edge of the box, but his left-footed shot was a comfortable save down the throat of Paul White.

After a similar attacking move just six minutes later, the ball once again fell to Turnbull outside the box, but once again White was able to keep the ball out of his net with another straightforward save.

Into the second half, Dunston began very brightly and had two glorious chances early on to level the contest. First, on 47 minutes, the ball fell to Jake Jensen from 25 yards out and the midfielder connected with a sweetly struck volley only for the ball to go just wide.

On 49 minutes, Fowler and Jenkins linked up with a nice one-two and the ball came back to Jenkins inside the box however, his attempt on goal sailed off target. The game was opening up, and Coalville came very close to doubling their lead on 51 minutes. McGlinchey, who had been a menace all game down the left, broke away from Michael Pearson and cut inside on his right foot only to drag his effort just wide.

On the hour-mark Coalville again came close to finding the back of the net on two occasions as Billy Kee and McGlinchey both fired attempts on goal off target. A sigh of relief echoed around The UTS Stadium on 65 minutes as Dunston finally managed to breakdown the Coalville defence to find the equaliser. Michael Fowler dropped the ball off to Jenkins on the edge of the box and the tricky midfielder shifted the ball onto his left foot and fired the ball past White.

Unfortunately, the lead would last only two minutes. With too many men ahead of the ball for Dunston, Coalville managed to find a way through after pinching the ball in the middle of the park and Chambers was able to scoop the ball into the empty net after avoiding the onrushing Dan Staples.

On 81 minutes, The Ravens had a two-goal cushion. McGlinchey managed to find himself in space down the left-hand side and crossed low into the box where Chambers was to tap home for his second of the game and all but guarantee Coalville's place in the hat for the next round.

Dunston continued to scratch and claw as Craig Scott twisted inside the Coalville box before taking aim only for Paul White to pull off another save. Ultimately, it just wasn't meant to be for Dunston after a valiant performance and our FA Trophy run comes to an end.

CLUB HISTORY | BRIDLINGTON TOWN

Bridlington Town AFC was formed in their own right on 11th June 1920. They recruited players from the disbanded Bridlington Discharged Sailors and Soldiers Football Club and formed a second team from The Bridlington Grammar School Old Boys. The first team were entered into the 1st division of the East Riding County League. In their first season Bridlington Town AFC won the East Riding Senior Cup 2-1 vs. Gilberdyke and reached fifth place in the League. Town went on to win the East Riding Cup the following 2 seasons and won the 1st Division title on three consecutive seasons in 1921–22, 1922–23 and 1923–24.

At the end of the 1924-25 season Bridlington Town were admitted to the Yorkshire League. After the First World War a group of school leavers, anxious to continue their enjoyment of football, decided to form their own club, which they named Bridlington Centrals. At first they competed in the Driffield & District Minor League and in due course they had to move up to the Driffield & District League. Eventually, they found themselves in the East Riding Amateur League where they enjoyed a fair amount of success which was climaxed by five consecutive championships in the fifties. In the same period Centrals also carried off the East Riding Senior Cup on two occasions and this success encouraged them to join the Yorkshire League in 1959 under the changed name of Bridlington Town.

The club immediately finished runners-up in Division Two and qualified for promotion to the First Division. They also reached the first round proper of the F.A.Cup for the first time where they lost to the then mighty Bishop Auckland.

In 1967 Bridlington dominated the Yorkshire League but Town had to settle for second best to Bridlington Trinity. In 1982 the Northern Counties (East) League emerged and Bridlington Town were originally placed in Division One North, but were elevated to the Premier Division in 1986 following the resignation of a number of clubs to join the Northern Premier League.

In the season of 1989/90. town were finalists at Wembley for the first time in the F.A. Vase, in front of a crowd of 7,932, the game finishing 0 – 0, the only ever Wembley final to be goalless, with Yeading winning the replay 1 – 0 at Elland Road 9 days later.

Ken Richardson had joined the club in this period as President and was instrumental in assisting the club with the necessary finance to develop the ground by building a new stand, clubhouse, turnstiles and floodlights.



Town were now regarded as one of the strongest teams in non-league football and reached Wembley again in 1993, this time in front of a slightly bigger crowd of 9,061, and returned the victors with a 1-0 win over Tiverton Town, thanks to a goal from Alan Radford. Town also won the Northern Premier (Unibond) League First division. Due to legal wrangles the team moved to play their home games at Doncaster Rovers ground and then folded, leaving Queensgate with no football during 1993 – 94.

Following the disbanding, an ambitious local 'PUB' side, The Greyhound, were inspired to make an approach to the lease-holders with a view to making the Queensgate ground the base for their team. A deal was struck with the condition that the club change their name to Bridlington Town AFC. The new era began an 10 September 1994 when the new Bridlington Town AFC took to the field for their first league game against Viking Panthers in the Driffield and District League Premier Division in front of 200 spectators.

Steady Progression saw the club join the East Riding County League Division One, and over the next three seasons in the club continued to improve and made application to the Northern Counties East League. A fifth place finish in that first season back in the NCEL was creditable, but during the Christmas period of 2000, Bowman was replaced by Billy Heath as manager.

Towns 3rd season back in the NCEL saw an 18 game unbeaten run lift Town to finish Division One Runners Up and gained promotion to the Premier Division. The 2002 – 2003 season started with a continuation of the good form and 14 straight wins in all competitions. Town also reached the 4th Qualifying round of the FA Cup, losing away at Conference side Southport, and the 1/4 final of the Vase, losing away at League rivals and eventual winners Brigg Town.

Another incredible run of league form saw Town lose only one of the last 26 games and the Club finished as Champions with a fantastic 20-point winning margin to gain promotion to the Unibond League for 2003 – 2004. To ensure promotion, Gary Wilkinson of Wilkinson Caravans, the main sponsor, also secured the purchase of Bridlington Town AFC Ltd from the former owners thus ensuring the future of the club.

Following promotion to the Unibond premier division, Gary Wilkinson was unable to continue with the club any longer due to financial constraints, and Pete Smurthwaite, of PBS Construction, bought the club. Town were relegated back to the Northern counties east league but the 2008/09 season saw the management team of Tim Hotte and Gary Allanson as joint Managers gain the club a 4th placed finish. With Gary Allanson and his new assistant Phil Harrison, the club went on to win the league by 11 points.

The 2010/11 season saw Town in the race to retain their title but just fell short losing out to Farsley with Parkgate being runners up. Allanson decided to leave the club at the end of the season, but his return in 2013/14 delighted fans as he guided the club to a stable mid table finish in the Northern Counties East.

The ever improving Seasiders managed a 5th place finish in the NCEL in 2015/16, but the following season saw Allanson leave the club due to personal reasons, and Chairman Peter Smurthwaite acted swiftly by appointing former professional footballer Curtis Woodhouse as manager.



In the 2017/18 season, Woodhouse had to rebuild the squad, and in doing so local lad Jake Day scored 48 goals and finished the top scorer in the NCEL Premier division. The following season saw Woodhouse step down as manager with immediate effect and Brett Agnew and Anthony Bowsley stepped in as caretaker managers to give some stability. Brett and Anthony were soon given the role as the full time Management team and it turned out to be a successful decision finishing third in the NCEL,

2020/21 saw Bridlington move into the Northern Premier League East Division, and with just a few months of the season to go Manager Brett Agnew announced he would be leaving the club at the end of the season. Bridlington were in a relegation battle that went down to the last match of the season. Lewis Dennison's 90th minute penalty against Dunston FC was the crucial goal that gave town the three points needed to stay up.

JAMES ANDERSON

Anderson joins on a year- long loan from Northern Premier League Outfit Morpeth Town.

The young keeper shone during his time on loan at Whickham and looks to bolster Dunston's promotion credentials. Anderson has two appearances under his belt at Morpeth, one of which included a penalty save in an FA Trophy game against Warrington Town. Anderson links up with new goalkeeping coach Lee Kennedy in what sees an all-new line-up in Dunston's goalkeeping department.



CRAIG BAXTER

Craig Baxter is a defensively strong and composed right back who brings a wealth of experience of playing higher up in leagues to the Dunston back line. Craig has a proven track record of success, a key player for The Mariners over a five-season spell and making 188 appearances and played an integral role in the Gateshead side which reached the National League playoff final at Wembley Stadium in the 2013/14 season. Described as rock solid at the back and strong going forward, Baxter's signing was a major coup for Dunston UTS FC, and Craig's addition was obvious, with the full back picking up the 2021/22 managers player of the season, players player of the season and committee's player of the season



Richard Coulson

Richie arrived in early December 2021 from Northern League side Whitley Bay. He has an eye for goal and picked up six goals in the back end of the 2021/22 season. Able to play anywhere across the frontline, Richie has added versatility to the Dunston side, and will be looking to kick on in the 2022/23 season. The forward has had spells with Seaham Red Star in The Northern League and prior to that had played for his local side Hazelrigg Victory for whom he scored 174 goals, registered 100 assists and won 31 Man of the Match awards in only 189 appearances.

Sadó Djaló

Sadó arrived early on in the 2021/22 season from Northern League side Bedlington Terriers, where he had made a serious impression. His credentials were there for all to see, with the frontman scoring 11 goals for Dunston in a short period for the club. Sadó was quickly snapped up by National League North outfit Blyth Spartans, however under new boss Terry Mitchell his playtime was limited. A short loan back to the UTS Stadium has been followed by a more permanent deal, which sees Sadó return looking to ignite old form.



Jack Elliott

Jack Elliott is a very talented player who returned to Dunston in September 2019 following a brief spell with Hebburn Town. He progressed through Newcastle United's Academy and has had spells at Consett AFC and Whickham. Jack adds speed to the Dunston side and causes headaches for full backs of opposing teams. Since his arrival, Jack has been an ever -present figurein the starting eleven and continues to give his all in a Dunston shirt.



Carl Finnigan :-

Carl arrived at the UTS Stadium in September 2022 following a period on the sidelines due to a health scare. After 8 months out, Finnigan will look to provide Dunston with experience and fire power up fornt, having enjoyed spells with Falkirk, Gateshead, South Shields, Whickham and Morepth Town. The frontman was on fine form for South Shields, scoring 72 goals in 115 games, including one at Wembley in the clubs FA Vase triumph. Carl has also enjoyed spells in South Africa and Botswana, and will be looking to reignite his fine goalscoring pedigree in what is a lethal front line.

Tez Galbraith :-

Terry Galbraith became Chris Swailes' second major signing of the 2020/21 season as the Club pulled of a major coup to bring the player back to where his footballing career began. On his signing, Dunston FC Manager Chris Swailes said, "For me he'll bring leader -ship, he's vocal wherever he plays, he'll bring experience, and these are valuable especially in this league". Galbraith made his name at Dunston FC as a youngster having joined from Redheugh Boys Club. He was a key player for Billy Irwin's FA Vase winning side in 2012 alongside Chris Swailes and Liam Connell.

Regarded as one of the brightest prospects in The Northern League during his first spell with the club, he left The UTS Stadium in November 2012 to join Darlington FC. During his seven seasons at Darlington, he would go on to win three promotion medals, making over 250 appearances and scoring over 50 goals for The Quakers and became a genuine favourite with their supporters. After leaving Darlington at the end of the 2019/20 season, Dunston moved quickly to secure his signature. Long standing Club Chairman Mr Malcolm James said, "When Terry became available it was just natural that we'd be interested in the lad". He added " We're a club that is looking to go forward; Terry Galbraith and recent signing Liam Connell are two lads who we've always wanted to bring back to the club as this is where their hearts are". Terry captained Darlington during the 2018/19 season and spent last season playing in The National League North. Considered to be one of the best left backs in the history of Dunston FC, he can play at the centre of defence, centre midfield and left wing, adding quality, leadership, and versatility to the Dunston side.







Michael Fowler :-

Michael Fowler arrived at The UTS Stadium having recentlycompleted a Scholarship in The USA with Coastal Carolina Chanticleers. He started his career with Sunderland AFC before then moving on to Burnley, where he was a prolific scorer at youth level. Having completed a successful scholarship with The Premier League side, he then joined Fleetwood Town as part of their development squad. He has had loan spells with FC United of Manchester, Guiseley and Bamber Bridge, before moving to the UTS Stadium in July 2021. Michael hit the ground running in his first season and scooped the clubs top scorer award despite being at the club for just half a season.





Jake Jensen :-

Jake was one of the multiple signings for the club in the summer of 2022. He was on a football scholarship in the United States for four years from Summer 2018 and that was where he most recently played. Jake is a technically gifted midfielder that brings energy and tenacity to the pitch along with a range of passing from the middle of the park. In his words, he tries to "emulate Bruno from the Toon.

Will Jenkins :-

Will Jenkins signed on-loan from South Shields in August 2022 and will remain with the club until January 2023. Will is a talented midfielder who has come through the youth system at The Mariners and has gone on to make over 40 appearances for the South Shields first team at quite a young age. Will can play across the midfield and netted his first goal for Dunston at Bridlington Town on August 19th in the Emirates FA Cup Preliminary Round.





Ursene Mouanda :-

Ursene joined Dunston FC from South Shields in early January 2020 and marked his debut with a Man of the Match performance in a 1-0 win away to Colne. Known as an athletic and competitive defensive midfielder, he was previously with Rangers before signing professional terms with Kilmarnock. A product of Monkseaton Academy, he was selected to captain England U18's Schoolboys in 2016, bringing him to the attention of numerous professional clubs. Following his release from Kilmarnock, he was quickly snapped up by South Shields. With competition for places at Mariners Park high, he spent the start of the 2019/20 season on Ioan at Blyth Spartans before arriving at The UTS Stadium and has been an ever-present member of Chris Swailes' side ever since.

Michael Pearson :-

Having previously played for Hartlepool United, Blyth Spartans and South Shields, the current Club vice-captain joined Dunston UTS FC prior to the start of the 2015/16 season from Consett AFC, a season in which he would receive The Player of the Season Award. An industrious and combative player, he possesses a versatility which allows him to comfortably play in numerous positions, he has since gone on to play more than 100 games for Dunston, captaining the side on many occasions.

His outstanding performances during Dunston's 2018/19 Northern League title winning season saw him deservedly collect a plethora of awards at the end of the season namely, Players' Player of the Year Award, Management Player of the Season and Committee Player of the Season. During his time at Dunston, Michael has collected a Northern League winners medal, Northern League Cup medal and JR Cleator Cup Winners medal.

Craig is a very experienced player at Northern League level having previously had two stints at Ashington and a spell at Slough Town while working in the London area.

"Scotty" played a vital role for the club during the Northern League title winning campaign and continues to be an assured and composed figure in the back line.

Jon Shaw :-

Jon signed for Dunston this summer from Northern Premier League side South Shields. Jon has a formidable record at non -league level within the North East, scoring 52 goals for Gateshead over two spells with the club.

The ex-forward, who has now

moved back into a central defensive position, adds an abundance of experience to the Dunston side. Spells at Luton Town, Sheffield Wednesday and Rochdale AFC outline his class, and he will add versatility and strength to the Dunston backline.









Dan Staples :-

Dan signed for the club in July 2022 after impressing during pre -season. The goalkeeper has has spells with Newcastle United, Sunderland, Wrexham and Bedlington Terriers. 

INTERVIEW | WILL JENKINS

Since joining Dunston on loan from South Shields in the Summer, Will Jenkins has continued to shine in a blue shirt. Will has contributed with seven goals so far this season including four goals in his last five games. On top of that, Will has swooped the last two man of the match awards. We sat down with Will to discuss the season so far.



Q: Will, you've been here a few months now, how are you settling in so far with your loan spell at The UTS Stadium?

WJ: I'm loving my time here. The lads have been great since I came in and we've been on a good run, so I am enjoying playing regularly with this group.

Q: You've showed some immense form since signing, including picking up the two latest 'Man of the Match' awards, what's been the key to your performances and, most importantly, have you finished all that beer yet?

WJ: I think consistency is the key. Playing week in and week out is helping me with my performances and confidence. Scoring a few goals and playing well makes a huge difference. I've tried a couple of the beers, but I'm sure they'll last a while in my cupboards!

Q: Last Saturday's game in the FA Trophy against Coalville Town was a tough one with the lads putting in a huge effort and a lot of players missing as well. What was the dressing room like after the game for that as it was our first defeat in 11 games?


