We would like to extend a very warm welcome to everyone in attendance at The UTS Stadium this afternoon for this PITCHING-IN Northern Premier League East Division game.

Our opponents today are SHEFFIELD FC who arrive at the UTS Stadium after their long journey from South Yorkshire. It's an honour for Dunston FC to play host to the undisputed "Oldest Football Club" in The World.

Sheffield FC were founded on 24th October 1857, almost six years before the formation of the Football Association in 1863. The Club insisted that most of the rules that they had formulated were adopted by the FA to govern the very early games that took place around that time. The very first Inter-Club Match was played between Sheffield FC and their near neighbours Hallam FC on Boxing Day in 1860.

Dunston FC were the visitors when Sheffield FC celebrated their 164th Anniversary on 23rd October 2021 in front of a bumper crowd of 879, with the entry charges slashed to 1850's values! A very competitive game ensued with Dunston taking a slender lead into half-time with a Jake Stafford goal. Sheffield stunned the visitors with an equaliser early in the second-half and defended with their lives before grabbing a decisive break-away winner late in the game to the joy of the home support.

Dunston FC will be keen to continue their recent improved form but will have to be at their best to overcome a spirited Sheffield FC side who can be at their most dangerous when underestimated. Their Team Management of Ryan Cresswell and Spencer Fearn have assembled a versatile and competitive playing squad who relish a battle for the points.

We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this afternoon. Referee Sam Parnaby travels from Bishop Auckland and he is joined by his Assistant Referees David Fittes from Washington and Paul Mosley from Wallsend. Our FA Match Observer today is Malcolm Langley who comes from Seaham.

Let's all remember the Covid-19 Guidance. Keep a safe distance from each other so that we can ensure the safety of everyone.

Club history

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium. Hello The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor.

With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back Northern League doubles in 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and continue to be some to this day.

At the start of the 2008/2009 season UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor.

The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C, the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

Arguably one of Dunston UTS FC's greatest achievements came in The FA Vase Final of 2012. In front of a crowd of 5,126 at Wembley Stadium, under the guidance of then Manager Billy Irwin, an Andrew Bulford brace ensured a 2-0 victory over Northern League rivals West Auckland Town.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East



Sunderland vs Newcastle Utd at Under 14' level. I scored twice in the last five minutes for Sunderland to win the game, so they'd be my favourites.


Do you think we'll fight for promotion this year?

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

An Interview with Craig Baxter

Craig Baxter has been one of the most consistent performers in a Dunston shirt this season and has brought in a wealth of experience to the side from his time playing in the higher levels at Gateshead and South Shields. He was instrumental in Gateshead's Conference Play-Off Final season which saw Baxter go just one game short of reaching the Football League.

We sat down with him to discuss his time at the club so far, the run in towards the back end of the season and his favourite pasty fillings.

You joined Dunston last summer, how's your experience been at Dunston so far?

I'm really enjoying my time so far at Dunston. I already knew the manager and some of the players, so it was easy to fit straight in. Everything has been spot on and they're a great group.

With a wealth of experience at Gateshead in the Conference and having also had time at South Shields, what do you feel has been the highlight of your career?

I don't think I could single out one moment during my time at Gateshead and South Shields but during my time at both I was able to experience success in winning promotions and trophies. Winning promotion to the conference with Gateshead and turning full time was a big step for the club and we just fell short one year in reaching League Two in the Play-Off Final.

At Shields we climbed a few leagues and won four cups in one year, so it was great to be part of two successful teams. Hopefully I'll be able to continue it on with Dunston.

We've had a real upturn in form since the turn of the year, what do you think has been the key to getting back to winning ways after a tough Christmas period?

Yes, we hit a sticky patch just before Christmas which wasn't great and losing our top scorer at the time didn't help, but we are a good team and have been working hard in training to put it right. We've got a few extra bodies in so competition for places is all over. Hopefully we can carry this run to the end of the season and see where we end up.

Despite their league position, Sheffield can be a dangerous side and beat us 2-1 in the reverse fixture earlier in the season. How important will it be to try and keep up the current momentum with three points this weekend?



All games are equally as important to get three points because ultimately, we want to finish in the playoffs. We must take one game at a time and see where it takes us. Losing down in Sheffield was disappointing as we should have put the game to bed in the first half, but that's football! We will be looking to rectify that result on Saturday and win.

We are 10 points off the playoffs, what's the message from Swaz and the rest of the management team as we approach the back end of the season?

Swaz and Jon have told us to keep chipping away and just win the next game, we know from our position it's going to be tough but we are good enough to beat anyone in this league on the day. We have to be consistent between now and the final game and hopefully the teams above us slip up – there is still plenty of points to play for.

The team's been given a £5 bonus each from Swaz following a good performance, but the only condition is that you have to spend it in Greggs – what are you going for?

I'm in Greggs at least three times a week so that's an easy one – mind you £5 doesn't stretch far in there anymore. I've got my own Greggs stamper, so I get a lot of free coffee! I'd go for a bacon and egg sarnie with red sauce, coffee, a chicken bake and to top it off a triple chocolate cookie.

Early Football.

Versions of football evolved in many early civilisations, example of these can be found in ancient China, Greece and Rome. In England the original games were played between villages in fields and streets. This 'Mob Football' involved hundreds of players and was little more than prolonged and violent street battles.

In the 19th century a more refined version of the game grew in popularity within the public schools and universities, each playing to their own sets of rules.

The Birth of Sheffield Foot Ball Club.

During the 1850s the enthusiasm and influence of ex-public school and university students spread the popularity of the game around Sheffield. In the summer of 1857 William Prest and Nathaniel Creswick agreed that the game would be a splendid candidate for organised sport during the winter months. The pair wrote to the Public Schools for information, regarding their varying rules, with the aim of drawing up a set of laws embodying the best points from each. On October 24th, 1857, the world's first football club was born in a greenhouse.

Among the first rules drawn up were laws asserting that "no hacking or tripping up is fair under any circumstances", "no player may be held or pulled over" and "it is not lawful to take the ball off the ground [using hands]" Upon the formation of the Football Association in 1863, Sheffield Club's insistence on these laws helped lead the evolution of the game we recognise globally today. Heading, crossbars, corner kicks, free-kicks for fouls, throw-ins, a half-time change of ends and floodlit matches can all be traced to the innovators of Sheffield FC

Early Years

Initially early matches, such as Married men v Unmarried, were played between club members. Records also show games against local army sides. Following victory over the 58th Army Regiment in 1860 a local report stated that, "most of the officers were adepts at the game, having, in their younger days, played in the public-school matches, and the victory of the civilians was quite unexpected."

Following the birth of Hallam FC, the world's first inter-club game took place on Boxing Day in 1860. The match "was conducted with good temper and in a friendly spirit", concluding in a 2-0 win for Sheffield.

For several years all matches were played locally, against a rising number of new sides, before the first 'out of town' match was played in Nottinghamshire in 1865. In 1866 Sheffield became the first non-London side to play under FA Laws when they met London at Battersea Park.

The FA Cup was founded in 1871 and in its third season Sheffield became the first northern side to take part and the first non-London side to win a tie. They succeeded in reaching the quarter finals in this and two further seasons also, 1876 and 1878, the club's support helping the FA Cup nearly treble in size and become a nationwide competition.

1872 saw the first international game, between England and Scotland in Glasgow, with Sheffield's Charles Clegg playing for the England side. Clegg would later go on to be Chairman, and President, of the FA and receive a knighthood for his services to the game.

From the 1880s onwards the rise of professionalism and Sheffield Club's firm insistence on retaining their amateur status saw them overtaken and overshadowed by other sides in the area. During these years the very survival of the club owed much to the leadership of former players Harry Chambers and Harry Broughton Willey.

It wasn't all doom and gloom though! In fact, Sheffield enjoyed possibly their greatest hour in 1904 when they won the Amateur Cup, beating Ealing 3-1 at Valley Parade, Bradford.

YORKSHIRE LEAGUE

1949 brought admission to the Yorkshire League and a resurgence, which saw the side promoted to Division 1 in their third season and reach the League Cup final in 1953. In 1957 they celebrated their Centenary year and reached their first Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup final in 1962.

After a period of yo-yoing between divisions the 1977 side were crowned Division 2 Champions and reached that season's FA Vase final at Wembley. They established themselves as a top division side in the Yorkshire League, lifting the League Cup in 1978, before joining the newly founded Northern Counties East League in 1982.

NORTHERN COUNTIES LEAGUE

The Division 1 title was won in both 1989 and 1991 and a first Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup win came in 1994. In 2001 the club acquired a permanent ground, for the first time, when moving to its current home. After the turn of the century the side began to consistently challenge for promotion, also winning the League Cup and Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup twice apiece. The 2006/07 season ended with a 2nd place finish and promotion to the Northern Premier League.

NORTHERN PREMIER LEAGUE

Club made an instant impact in reaching the 2008 play-off final, narrowly losing only on penalties. That first season also saw games against Inter Milan and Ajax at Bramall Lane, as part of the 150th birthday celebrations, and a few years later a win at Hallam's Sandygate ground to mark the same anniversary of the first inter-club match. Sheffield were then twice more involved in the play-offs over the next few seasons and lifted the Sheffield & Hallamshire FA Cup again in 2008 and 2010. After finishing 9th in 2012/13 the side languished in the bottom half of the table for five years before finishing 4th and reaching the play-offs in 2019.

With thriving women's, Reserves, disability, and futsal teams the club goes from strength to strength and stays true to its roots in playing for the love of the game.

MARC NEWSHAM – Forward. Former Rotherham United, Boston United and Matlock Town striker returns to The Club 13 years after making appearances on loan whilst on professional terms with the Millers. Marc scored 110 goals in 209 appearances for Boston United before joining Evo-Stik Premier Division Matlock Town three seasons ago.

A Craig Baxter free kick from wide out was whipped in and Fowler beat the offside trap and deftly headed the ball beyond Culverwell for 2-0, leading to jubilant scenes from the Dunston faithful, of whom made up a good 75% of the crowd inside the ground, if not more.

By this point Chris Swailles' side were well in control of the game and after Jack Elliott had a shot blocked on the line, he too had his goal as a poor goal kick was capitalised on by Michael Fowler, who raced in behind the defence. His shot was well saved by Culverwell but nothing could be done to stop the on rushing Jack Elliott who put the ball into the empty net for 3-0.

LOOKING BACK TO 27th JANUARY 2015 MATCH REPORT

27 January 2015 - EBAC Northern League Cup Dunston UTS 4 Stokesley SC 2

Dunston were back in cup action in the League cup and welcomed second division side Stokesley Sports Club in the League Cup at the Dunston UTS Stadium. Dunston were without Harrison but welcomed back Cattannach at right full back, Clark in goal and Coulson at centre half with Bulford on the bench. Dunston set off well putting Stokesley under pressure, on 2 minutes Dixon shot wide, 2 minutes later Wilson shot from an angle just over the bar, a minute later had a punt on target which the keeper spilled then recovered before the attackers pounced, on 6 McAndrew played in a cross which Bowman did well to collect low down. Stokesley were awarded free kick 40 yards out Sharples played the ball into the Dunston area and Dixon unchallenged mis directed his clearance past his own keeper into the top corner of the net for a goal to Stokesley after 7 minutes. Dunston reacted immediately as a Wilson shot was palmed away by Bowman and then a Kane cross was headed wide by McAndrew. On 9, Williams had a 30 yard shot which curled away past the far post.

After 11 Grier headed over the Dunston bar from a Marrow corner. After 2 more minutes Wilson got up to head down to Dixon who on the turn volleyed the ball into the net for the equaliser. Dunston still applying the pressure and on 15, Kane fed the ball back to Ormston who shot over the bar. 2 minutes later, a neat exchange between Wilson and Ormston gave Wilson the chance to shoot just over the cross bar. On 18, a Cattannach cross fell to Wilson whose shot on target was blocked. After 22, Dixon had a shot from 15 yards which Bowman saved, a minute later Dunston got their reward as a Halliday cross was met by Wilson whose header up onto the underside of the cross bar was unstoppable and it was 2-1 to Dunston after 23. On 24 McAndrew fired in a cross which Bowman saved low down. After taking the lead the game seemed to stabilise as Stokesley came back into the game, but after a short respite Dunston were at them again on 33 when McAndrew fed Wilson whose shot was blocked for a corner.

Four minutes later Ormston fed Halliday whose shot went over the bar. Bowman prevent another goal on 42 as he saved a Wilson shot on the turn and then 2 minutes later, Ormston got in a header from a Kane cross which was blocked and cleared.

At half time Dunston lead 2 - 1. Wightman replaced Dixon who picked up a knock just before half time and Dunston restructured with Kane taking a more central roll.

On 47 Halliday had a shot which was deflected for a corner. A minute later Wightman was in the action as his low cross was deflected for another corner. From a Halliday corner kick on 50 minutes Cattannach got in header back across goal and Ormston was on hand to flick the ball into the Stokesley net for Dunstons third goal. Dunston were still pressing and on 53 Halliday had a shot saved low down by Bowman, this was followed by a Wightman cross headed back across goal by Wilson but McAndrew was just unable to convert as the ball went wide. After 63 Kane received a ball from McAndrew and shot high into the net for Dunstons fourth goal. Dunston still continued pressing and on 66 Ormston received a ball on the left from Halliday but his shot was wide of the target. Bulford replaced the limping Williams on 66 and immediately set about trying to add to his season total of goals but the Stokesley defence where being defiant and he was restricted to a shot over the bar from 25 yards out on 73 and then on 85 when Bulford was played in 8 yards out but saw Bowman pull off a save. On 87 Wightman had a shot on target blocked before in a breakaway move Campbell beat the Dunston offside trap and played a shot past the advancing Clark for Stokesley's second goal. Dunston had one further chance when Ormston had a header saved by the excellent Bowman who prevented Dunston from scoring more goals.
