Earlier in the week we spoke to Club Chairman Malcolm James to discuss the current ground improvements underway at The UTS Stadium.

As people who were here last Saturday will have noticed, there have been a few changes to The UTS Stadium. We have had to do internal work to improve the standard and size of the Officials changing rooms. We've got two new Portacabins which have come in; one is going to be for the Gents outside toilets and another one which is going to be for the new Club shop.

The Club shop is growing bigger and bigger and more popular on match days and everything in there is also available on-line through our website and social media platforms. We've also got a medical room which is a requirement of the ground grading standards, where you to have a medical room away from the changing rooms, and obviously it can't be too far away, so we've positioned it as close as possible to the main changing rooms. We're finishing everything off hopefully this week in that area.

We've made changes to The Tommy Cooney Stand, particularly spectator standing behind the dug outs. We'd identified a problem as spectators were unable to see above the dug-outs on the bottom tier. We're busy re-sizing the standing and increasing visibility.

Another major thing we're doing this week is improving the lamps to increase the Lux value on the floodlights. Presently they're only 120 LUX, which was the requirement when we were in the Northern League. Stepping up a League, we've had to increase the LUX value to 200. Hopefully that will bring us up to date with our current ground improvements and from there we can push on and see what happens this season. Who knows, next season we may have to do something else at the end of this season, but at least we're more or less there for the start of this season.

We've really made these changes with spectators in mind. We'd really love to see more people in the community come along and give us their support. We did notice a good crowd on Saturday, although there was something out in the press and media asking people not to come along and support grass roots sport. We've got a ground capacity of 2,500, we're allowed 200 in at the moment, so there's ample room for people to maintain Social distancing guidelines. We've got sanitisers all around the Stadium, we're operating a track and trace system, we've got ensured the seats within the stands and around the stadium are distanced correctly and we've worked very hard to ensure that The UTS Stadium is a safe environment so you've got no fears in coming down to watch and support us.

This season, we've kept our Supporters in mind again. We've not increased the cost of Season tickets which are priced at £100 for adults and £50 for Under 16's and concessions. This covers 19 games in The Pitching-In Northern Premier League at home this season and works out at about £5/£2.50 per game. We're offering excellent value for money.

Our uptake on season ticket renewals has been excellent, we'd like to thank those who have renewed this season for their continued support. We urge our supporters and those within the area to really get behind us this season. It really does mean an awful lot to the players when they have a good win, like we did on Saturday against Marine, and are clapped off the field for their performance. It adds an excellent atmosphere within the ground and is a reward to all those at the club.

I'd like to commend those on the Committee who have worked tirelessly and done a lot of work over the past months and weeks to get everything ready for this season. We're a Family club and we'd like to encourage people to come along and give us a try this season. We're on your doorstep and would happily welcome you to The UTS Stadium this season

In this interview we talk to Terry Galbraith. Tez returned to the UTS Stadium this summer having spent 7 seasons at Darlington FC. His signing was seen by many as a major coup, as Chris Swailes began strengthening his squad for this season.

We got off to a fantastic start to the season with a 2-1 win against Marine on Saturday, what were you thoughts on how the game went?

I thought the game was pretty evenly matched between the 2 sides but I thought we just done enough to deserve the 3 points over the 90minutes. They were a pretty well organised side, so it was good confidence for us to come away with the win going into the next one on Saturday.

You scored on your debut with a very well taken penalty, big pressure moment in the game, then Liam's pulled off a brilliant save at the end to ensure the win, the pair of you must be happy with your performances.

Yeah well to be honest I probably wouldn't have taken it had Fitzy of been on, but I've taken penalty's plenty of times in the past and I'd always fancy taking one given the opportunity.

Liam's presence was massive for us, particularly in later stages, when they were throwing everything at us. He got us over the line in the end. I think everyone who was involved put in a performance on Saturday, including the subs, who came on and changed the game for us and gave us something a little different.

As expected it was a tough game on Saturday, Marine are one of the top sides in this League and we've got two tough games coming up against Colne and Ossett Utd.

We knew Saturday was going to be very tough and to be honest I think most games will be. If we apply ourselves like that in each game we play in, then I'm sure we will continue to win a lot more games.

With the Club having to withdraw from this seasons F.A. Cup, which I'd imagine was hugely disappointing to say the least for the lads in the dressing room, do you think that allows you all to fully focus on the a successful league campaign this season and could it even give you an advantage?

Everyone was obviously gutted what happened but that wasn't in control so we had to quickly forget about it and focus on the next game coming up. Although it was a massive disappointment, I always say you get judged on your league position come the end of the season and not so much cup runs so hopefully we can keep winning games and finish as high as possible

You've spent years at Darlington playing in front of some really big crowds, with passionate supporters, how much does that help players to do well when you've got that level of support behind you and have you got a message for the Dunston supporters for this season?

Yeah it's massive, the more fans get behind a team usually results in better performances at any level of football. I just say to keep supporting us throughout the season as we and the club need it and I'm sure come the end of it they'll be proud of the effort the lads have put in every week.

Dunston Football Club History

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium.

The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor. With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football. In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back First Division title winners and League Cup winners in seasons 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and Astley Signs became our away shirt sponsor. Both companies are still with us at the present time. Season 2008/2009 a company, UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor.

The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C, the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on the playing side.

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East.



The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation is a charity set up in memory of Daniel Wilkinson who died in 2016 aged 24, while playing the game he loved, from an underlying heart condition called Arrhythmogenic Right Ventricular Cardiomyopathy (ARVC).



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.
- Warning signs may include light-headedness, fainting, palpitations, swollen legs, breathlessness.
- Every week in the UK, 12 apparently fit and healthy young people (aged 35 and under) die from previously undiagnosed heart conditions.
- In Italy, where screening is mandatory for all young people engaged in organised sport, they have reduced the incidence of young sudden cardiac death by 89%.

OUR MISSION

The Daniel Wilkinson Foundation has been set up to raise awareness of SCD and to provide funding towards heart screening, defibrillators and CPR/defibrillator training primarily for grass-roots sporting teams.

Tragedies can be prevented through cardiac screening. It is vital that young people are identified and treated.





Dunston FC vs Marine 19th September 2020

Pitching In Senior North West Division

Dunston get their season off to an excellent start with a well-earned 2-1 win at home to Marine AFC.

Despite trailing to an excellent Niall Cummins goal on 40 minutes, with blue shirts around him the dangerous forward caught the ball well on the half volley on the edge of the box to loop the ball past Connell, it was a first half that never really got going. However, the home side's second half performance showed how good of a side Chris Swailes has engineered for this season.



Dunston deservedly levelled the game on 64 minutes, as Marine's attempts to remove the danger failed on more than one occasion, a Luke Page cross was headed away by David Raven but fell to Jake Stafford, majestically striking the ball on the volley from 25 yards out, his venomous effort rattled the cross bar and with Marine keeper Mendes seemingly perplexed as the location of the ball, and the crossbar still reverberating, last season's top scorer Mark Fitzpatrick reacted far quicker than the Marine defenders to get to the loose ball and knock the ball back across as the scrambling defender deflected the ball into his own net. In typical centre forward style, Fitzy claimed it. "I was the only one there, so it's mine". Fair enough.

The home side were rightly awarded a penalty on 82 minutes, Liam Thear cynically pulled down in the box having skipped past three defenders like a Gazelle on a trampoline. Terry Galbraith stepped up to the spot to send the keeper the wrong way with nonchalantly taken penalty. Dunston's second half performance merited their lead, the home side hassled and pressed endlessly throughout the second half,

playing the ball on the deck created issues for Marine, who had previously coped well with aerial balls against Dunston forward line.

As much as Marine created chances towards the end, Niall Cummins going close with an overhead kick and Adam Hughes narrowly missing a sliding effort at the back post in the dying embers of an entertaining second half, Dunston were worthy winners.

Marine's keeper Mendes was shown a red card after the game, remonstrating with the Officials, for reasons unbeknownst to most, in a performance that conjured up a moment of true comedy value for the home supporters gathered, with the keeper feigning a spectacular back injury, in which he appeared to act like a Man who had been bitten by a venomous Snake, despite John Thompson's spectacular efforts to have the pitch looking immaculate, one can only surmise that the removal of venomous snakes from the pitch may have been neglected during a somewhat hectic week for the good people at the Club, hard working Men and Women who spend hours of their free time ensuring that The UTS Stadium is in perfect condition for what is hopefully an excellent season ahead.

Speaking to Manager Chris Swailes after the game, he had this to say on the game:

"I thought it was an excellent win against a good side who I think will be up towards the top end of the table this season". "We've not trained as a group for 14 days, for obvious reasons, so to put in a performance like we did today, I'm delighted".

"In the first half they coped with what we had, particularly up top, we've got options and we had two forwards sitting on the bench. The introduction of Scrappy and Brooksy changed the game. I've still got Michael Pearson and Mechack Kanda to come back into the squad, so competition for places wise, it's a good position to be in".

Club Captain Craig Scott also gave his summary on the match:

"Over the moon to get a good start, it was really important to get 3 points against Marine, who we know are a good side from last season having played them 3 times, that makes it even better for me so I'm really happy".

"It was definitely a game of two halves, I think they probably edged the first half and we never really got going, Marine deservedly went in 1-0, but second half we came alive and they never really got going, we've scored Fitzys goal and if Staffy had of scored that we'd have never heard the end of it to be honest, I'm pleased Fitzy scored, then obviously a great pen by Tez to make it 2-1".

"Today was one of those classic NPL games, we would've probably lost that one last year, but we've taken the learnings from last season in those gritty games, where there's long balls and you're heading it, it's more of a scrap than anything else and I'm pleased that we came out on top this time".



Colne F.C. were formed in January 1996, by a group of like-minded people under the wing of now Life President Dave Blacklock. The enthusiasts combined their strengths and knowledge of non-league football, and arrangements were made for a new club to use the vacant Holt House Stadium, once used by the Dynamoes in the North West Counties Football League Division Two.

Colne FC's first ever competitive game was on the 17th August 1996 against Middlewich and the result ended in a 1 – 0 defeat.

The team was then managed by Keith Mason, but after his resignation soon after, Denzel Hart was appointed to the hot seat. His first game was a 6-0 defeat away at Ashton Town, but just two games later Colne FC recorded their first ever victory thumping Bacup Borough 5-2. The highlight of the season, coming when the reserves won the BEP Cup at Clitheroe's Shawbridge ground.

In the summer of 2002 James Webster took control of the club, to become the youngest chairman in the league at the age of 24. James was a player at the club with plenty of experience and along with his father who was vice chairman, had a strong desire to see the current side emulate the success of its predecessors.

Webster responded immediately by appointing Nigel Coates as the new manager as well as player Gary Rishton as his number 2. Nigel had played for the Dynamoes, being in the FA Vase winning team and had experience of management at local rivals Nelson.

Season 2003/04 brought back the glory days to Colne with a string of successes. In the League Colne had to play catch up after a successful cup run, but ended the season 10 points clear in Division two, scoring 102 goals in their 38 games. Colne completed the double by winning the Division Two Trophy 1 – 0 over Great Harwood.

The season was capped by an amazing run in the FA Vase for a North West Counties Football League Division Two club, they progressed all the way to the semi-finals, (via an incredible 1-2 away win at AFC Wimbledon) before being defeated over two legs 4-3 on aggregate to AFC Sudbury.

As the season progressed attendances started to rise as the local population realised we were no longer the whipping boys of the league, and the famous RED ARMY was formed.

In November 2013 Colne's manager for the past 10 years Nigel Coates stepped down from the hot seat and former Colne player Steve Cunningham was appointed manager, with another former Colne favourite Ted Cockett as his No.2 and Coach.

Steve and Ted had ambitious plans for the club and wasted no time in bringing in a few new faces to boost the playing squad, consolidating for the rest of the season but with big hopes and plans for the following seasons.

Season 2014-15 proved to be a year of progress in terms of league placing, with Colne finishing a creditable fourth.

Season 2015-16 proved to be the best ever in Colne FC twenty year history. The reds battled for the NWCFL Premier title with Runcorn Linnets and Atherton Collieries with the Reds winning the title with an 81st minute goal at 1874 Northwich securing 100 points and 100 + goals upon the way. The reds also reached the final of the League Cup before falling to Atherton.

2016-17 saw the Reds compete at level 4 for the first time in their history and finished a more than creditable 5th and the final play-off spot which the Reds lost in the semi-final to Farsley Celtic. The Colne fans earned many accolades throughout the season for their fine and vocal support of the team.

2020-21 With a new manager and back room staff in place Colne are looking forward to the new season and again look to be a challenger in a very strong league.
