Our opponents today are NORTH FERRIBY FC who arrive at the UTS Stadium after their long journey from Humberside. The two Clubs have met only once before when North Ferriby United FC visited the UTS Stadium as Northern Premier Premier Division members and Dunston were playing in the Northern League. That match took place before the unfortunate demise of "The Villagers" original winding-up in March 2019.

Amazingly, their Club was re-formed the very next month, in April 2019, and came back very much stronger. They gained entry into the North Counties East League and after winning promotion to their Premier Division, went on to eventually achieving a further promotion back to the NPL when ending as Champions by a superb



14 points margin in season 2022-2023. Manager Chris Bolder and his Assistant-Manager Paul Robson have retained most of their experienced playing squad for this season and have added some very promising younger players who have all come through the Academies at League Clubs in an attempt to continue their Club's progress.

They have made a very strong start on their rerturn to the NPL and will provide a stern test for Dunston today. We also extend a warm welcome to our Match Officials this afternoon. Referee Jamie Cann makes the journey from Stockton and he is joined by his Assistant Referees George Guilfoyle from Ingleby Barwick and Jack Whitfield from Whitley Bay.

Supporters old and new are very well appreciated and we hope you enjoy your visit to the UTS Stadium this afternoon. BILLY MONTAGUE – CLUB SECRETARY

The Club first saw light of day in 1975 as the Football Section of a Print Works Sports & Docial Club. Long-serving Club stalwart John Thompson, along with some of his fellow workmates at Her Majesty's Stationery Office Gateshead, formed the team and joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton, Newcastle.

Early success inspired John to develop the Club and it moved to a new base, The Bay Horse public house in Whickham. The Club name was changed to Whickham Sports FC. Playing on a public parks pitch in Dunston, the Club entered the Northern Amateur League. Numerous successes were achieved at this level including League Championships and League Cup wins.

In 1980 the Club joined the Northern Combination League. Further League and Cup triumphs followed and a move to a base nearer the home ground seemed logical. The Club moved to a new base at the Dunston Mechanics Social Club and became known as Dunston Mechanics FC. As the club progressed, land in the locality was leased from Gateshead MBC and the management committee began to develop the present ground.

At this stage an approach was made to the Federation Brewery for sponsorship to assist in the progress of the Club. When they kindly agreed to become the Club's main sponsors, the name was changed to Dunston Federation Brewery F.C. After finishing as League Champions and League Cup Winners in 1987, the Club left the Northern Combination League and joined the Wearside League. Following a period of four seasons in the Wearside League – being League Champions twice and League Cup Winners once – the club felt a

need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern Football League.

During their time in the Wearside League, the club had made considerable improvements to Federation Park with progress to a higher status of football in mind, and their application to join the Northern League was successful. The Club had now realised one of its main ambitions and so entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football.

In its second season in the Northern League, the Club won the Second Division Title and was promoted to the First Division. That season also saw the Club reach the last eight of the national FA Vase competition.

The Club was now an established Northern League Club having won the League Challenge Cup three years in succession from 1998 to 2000. Dunston also won the J. R. Cleator Cup in 1999/2000 and 2000/2001. Season 2003/2004 was one to remember when the club won the Northern League Championship for the first time and also lifted the League Challenge Cup. They also reached the final qualifying round of the F.A. Cup – the furthest they have ever reached in that competition.

After such a magnificent season in 2003/2004, the club went one better the following season when they repeated the Northern League Championship and Challenge Cup Double and also lifted the J. R. Cleator Cup once more.

In 2009, having been without a main sponsor for the previous three seasons, Mr. Shaun Sadler of UTS Engineering kindly agreed to provide a generous sponsorship package and it was agreed that the

Club be known as Dunston UTS Football Club. The name of the ground was changed from Federation Park to The UTS Stadium.

The Club enjoyed a momentous season in 2011-2012 when, under the

Management duo of Billy Irwin and Tony Harrison, they finished third in the Northern League and achieved the greatest success in their history. After a memorable run in the FA Vase, the side reached the Final at Wembley Stadium and went on to lift the trophy with a superb 2-0 victory over West Auckland Town.

After a few barren years, the Club sprang back to life again at the end of the 2017-2018 season when finishing as Runners-Up in the Durham Challenge Cup Final and going one better with victory in the Brooks Mileson Memorial League Cup Final. Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018-2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the BetVictor Northern Premier North West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the "Club Playing Name" must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club Title before the new season commenced. Shaun Sadler showed remarkable understanding of the situation and agreed to continue his wonderful sponsorship of the Club. With the aid of a generaous grant from the FSIF, improvements were completed to bring the ground up to NPL standards.

The step up proved more difficult than expected in the NPL North West Division and it wasn't until the turn of the year that the team achieved any real consistency. The early cancellation of League proceedings due to Covid-19 in March 2020 saw the Club finish in mid-table.

After yet another early curtailment in 2020-21, Dunston started the 21-22 season in the newly formed NPL East Division much stronger and finished in sixth-place, just missing out on the end-of-season Play-Offs. Last Season saw yet another upgrade in playing strength and more stadium improvements but the same disappointing final finish of sixth from top.

In a very competitive Division, we will have to go that extra step in the 2023-24 season if we are to achieve our aim of promotion but under the guidance of our new Team Manager Jon McDonald and his Coaches we will do our best!

Now embarking on a new challenge at The UTS Stadium, Barclay cannot wait to get going.


"I have heard some good things about Dunston and, with me not signing for anyone, I thought it would be a good level to start playing at and learn from.

HARRY BARCLAY (Defender)



Jack was also selected to represent England Universities for a round of friendly fixtures against Wycombe Wanderers and Gateshead in May 2023.







Still a young lad, his development has been there for all to see, and he asserted himself into the starting line-up on a number of occasions last season.




JACK MASKELL (Forward)






JUDE SWAILES (Defender)

Alongside his studies, he completed a three year placements at Park View Academy of Sport and was able to develop his skills as a practitioner.





Ponte Colls 1-1 Dunston FC (07/10/23)

Jack Maskell's 92nd minute goal was cancelled out in cruel circumstances as Pontefract snatch 95th minute equaliser.



Dunston travelled to Leeds to take on Pontefract Collieries on the back of two wins against Brighouse and Liversedge. The hosts were also in good form, picking up seven points from their last three games. Both sides headed into the game on sixteen points, with Dunston sitting fifth and the hosts in third.

The first chance of the game came early on, as Graeme Pickering was forced to come quickly flying out of his goal to deny Adam Haw with a great one-on-one save. Dunston went straight up the other end and Sado Djalo swung a ball into the mixer, but Jack Maskell couldn't keep his header down beneath the crossbar.

Pontefract had their best chance of the half after thirteen minutes, as the pitch conditions played their part when Jack Walker slipped with the ball at his feet in the Dunston penalty area, but Adam Haw failed to convert from close range after the ball was pulled back to him.

Not long after, the pitch again thwarted Dunston as Dale Pearson charged through on goal, but slipped before he could shoot.

The rest of the half consisted of multiple pieces of brilliance from Dale Pearson on the left wing, as he had Elliott Owen's number. Beating the fullback on numerous occasions, Pearson put a couple of dangerous balls across the box, with Djalo coming close with a back post shot, but Aleksander Petkovic managed to gather the ball in his hands.

The second half started with dramatic fashion, as Dunston were awarded a penalty early on, after a foul on Richard Coulson. Most people in the crowd were very confused as to why the penalty had been awarded, as there was a decent chunk of advantage time played between the foul and the penalty being awarded. Dale Pearson stepped up to take the penalty against Aleksander Petkovic, but the Pontefract goalkeeper dived low to his left and saved Pearson's effort, keeping the score level.

The rest of the second half was incredibly quiet, with notable highlights being Adam Haw coming close with a free-kick and the Pontefract supporters making the same joke towards the referee at least a hundred times. The game was incredibly scrappy, with the ball spending most its time airborne.

But Dunston's moment came in stoppage time, as the referee awarded a free kick on the halfway line for a foul on Sado Djalo. Craig Baxter took it quickly, and Jack Maskell expertly flicked it into the bottom right corner as the Dunston team wheeled away in celebration.

But moments later, the everlasting threat of Jack Greenhough's long throw-ins punished Dunston as Bailey Thompson stabbed home from close range, after Graeme Pickering had denied the initial shot. There were appeals from Dunston that the ball had blatantly gone out of play prior to the throw-in, but ultimately Dunston were punished with a late equaliser.

The result pushed Dunston up the table to fourth, and even though winning would have seen Jon McDonald's men top of the table, in the end it was hard earned, well fought point.

NORTH FERRIBY HISTORY

Although there's evidence that football had been played within the village since the turn of the century, it's not until after the great war we can establish for certain that North Ferriby Football Club had been formed.

Sadly, there's no record of how the club started, most likely an informal meeting of like- minded gents in a smoke-filled corner of the local pub. The first published record is of participation in the East Riding Intermediate Cup on November 6, 1919. A further Hull Daily Mail report in January 1920 revealed North Ferriby had played consecutive fixtures on Christmas Day (won 8-2), Boxing Day (won 3-2) and December 27 (won 2-0).

An auspicious start for the club and perhaps a precedent for future success, although one doubts that teams nowadays would, or even could play three in three. One of the earliest successes was in reaching the final of the South Howdenshire Cup in 1921 against Howden.

The game was played at Howden in front of a crowd of 1,500, an "unprecedented assemblage including a large number of Ferriby supporters" according to the HDM, who further reported that each set of fans were "gaily bedecked with their club's colours".

Unfortunately, Harry Thomas, the Ferriby captain, had to be satisfied with a runners-up medal as the team eventually went down 2-1 having finished the game with just ten men following the loss of scorer Arthur Kirby through injury at half time. No substitutes in those days.

On April 28, 1923 North Ferriby hosted the final of the South Howdenshire Cup between Melton and Willerby. One can start to imagine the immense pride of the clubs committee and volunteers as they busily prepared their pitch on the outskirts of the village.

Fast forward to January 2020 and Ferriby stalwarts are again filled with pride as news was broken their Dransfield Stadium has been nominated to host an England U18 International against Scotland on Thursday, April 9. Who would have thought that might be possible for a tiny village back in the day.

No one's certain what happened to North Ferriby FC during the early 1930's, but in 1934 the second element of this incredible trilogy began with the

formation of North Ferriby United, a village club extraordinaire.

In their very first season, NFU were runners up in the East Riding Church League Division One, but also went on to win the League Cup in that inaugural season. Astonishingly, by the time of its demise in March

2019, NFU had achieved no less than 64 major honours, including eight promotions and appearances in both National Stadiums.

The first Wembley visit was in the 1997 FA Vase Final when the team went down to a strong Whitby Town side in the shadow of those famous white towers, but that disappointment was put firmly behind supporters when in 2015 North Ferriby completed the giant killing of giant killings by overcoming "full time" Wrexham in the final of the FA Trophy beneath the iconic arc of the new Wembley Stadium.

Between 1934 and 1954 football was played on several sites within the village. Humber Road, Corby Park and Pickerings Field are all listed locations. Significantly, in 1954 Sir Arthur Atkinson stated at the opening ceremony that it was very rare for a Village to have "such splendid facilities". The clubs then committee and volunteers had acquired unwanted bricks from a disused building and constructed in their own time and at their own expense a brick pavilion. So good was the quality of construction, the building is still in situ and used by the cricket club today.

But the urge to progress was like a baton being passed on and on and by 1969 the need to move again had been determined after club officials decided the best way forward lay within the wider bigger world of the then Yorkshire League. To meet requirements, a new pitch was needed and so eyes turned to a veritable wilderness that lay between the playing field and the railway. An area of land originally designated for allotments after the Second World War, but subsequently laid unused.

The local Parish Council were approached and the outcome was the granting of a lease, the proceeds of which would support the Parish's obligations for maintenance of the playing fields. A win-win all round and an enduring arrangement still in existence today, albeit at a significantly higher contributory level from the football club.

The jungle was levelled, the access track (now Grange Lane) was improved, a car park dug out and covered. Two condemned pre-fabs were acquired from Beverley Borough Council and daily sweepings of cement were taken from Earls Cement. Finally, posts and rails were bought for £40 from Hull Brunswick and the

foundations of the now Dransfield Stadium had begun.

Unfortunately, the club couldn't afford to connect drains to the main sewer that lay 400 meters away under Church Road, so a cesspit was dug inside the ground under the entrancecar park. When the day came for the big opening a large crowd gathered to witness arrivalof the first Tetley delivery. The dray wagon swept majestically into the ground and thenimmediately collapsed into the cesspit where it remained for several days until a JCBeventually pulled it out. It has been said many times, there's an easy way, a hard way andthen the Ferriby way.

Following a progressive building programme lasting over 20 years between 1994 and 2014, all necessary to keep pace with ground requirements associated to progress on the pitch, the now Dransfield Stadium has developed beyond comprehension to those early days. Butnot before the third and final part of this trilogy would emerge.

In March 2019 the unthinkable happened. After a three year decline in fortunes, two relegations and irresponsible financial management, North Ferriby United was wound up inthe Hull courts. Gone forever. Or so was thought. On 1 April 2019, yes April Fools Day, NorthFerriby Football Club rose from the ashes like a phoenix. Within six short months 18 teams had been formed. Men, women and nearly 200 children all brought together to once againensure the great Ferriby tradition continues.

After two COVID hit seasons in the Northern Counties East League Division 1 North Ferribywere promoted to the NCEL Premier Division via the play offs. After finishing runners up inthe League they beat Rossington Main and Harrogate Railway to secure promotion.

The 2022-23 season got off to a disastrous start with five goalkeepers having to be used forvarious reasons within the first four weeks. Furthermore, quick fire exits from the FA Cup and FA Vase ensured the Club could now literally 'concentrate on the League'. And how well did that turn out! The club went on to win the League by a whopping 14 points and secure back-to-back promotions for the first time in club history. A club from North Ferriby are back in The Northern Premier League for the first time since March 2019!




CLIFF STARKEY | TREASURER, COMMITTEE, SUPPORTER

With every non-league football club, it's the people behind the scenes that make everything tick. Cliff Starkey is a prime example of that. A man who has dedicated multiple years to our football club. We asked him to write a piece for the latest edition of 'The Dunstoner', to share his memories over the years with the football club.

"I was asked to write a piece for the programme and my first thoughts were, where do I start and then my second thoughts were, where will I finish?

Anybody who knows me knows I love my football and always will, to the point that I got married on a Monday because I was playing on the Saturday and I managed to fit a 5 a side game in when my wife was in labour. I did score 4 but didn't tell her until after the birth of our son.



Although I never played at a high level, I was content to play with work colleagues on Saturdays and my mates on Sundays.

I kept going until I was 48 and enjoyed every minute of it. A little known fact is that I played table tennis to a much higher level, but had to chose between the two and there could only be one winner.

My union with the then Dunston Fed, now Dunston UTS FC, started back in 2000 when I had not long since finished playing over 40's football, the knees were shot. I was asked to manage the Sunday junior side and happily did that for 2 years.

During my time as Manager, we were undefeated in all league games during my tenure. The lads had then reached the maximum age and I thought I was

finished, until one cold night at
Morpeth watching the seniors, where
I was approached by Malcolm James
and asked to join the committee to
take on the role of treasurer. I was
very interested but said I would have
to discuss it with my wife, Elaine, as
it was a big undertaking.

Little did I know that Malcolm and Elaine had already talked about it over a corned beef and potato pie, and as she didn't want me at home all the time, the job was mine. Some transfer fee that mind.




For the next 10 years I threw myself in to the treasurers job but also managed to replace thousands of divots, sweep up millions of leaves, paint umpteen things, serve in the Cabin, serve in the bar, get stuck up a tree, nearly take a finger off, fall through a set of old wooden ladders, take the Micky out of people in the programme and not least, serve as the oldest ball boy in town with 100% record for finding the ball.

I'm pretty sure these tasks weren't in the job description, but this is what the committee at our club do and probably every other non/league club in the country. Saying that it was usually done whilst having a good laugh and carry on, except the finger, because you had to have a laugh, or you just wouldn't do it.

During my tenure we had some great players, great teams and won loads of trophies, including back-to-back league and cup doubles, with the Cleator cup added to make them trebles.

My time as Treasurer came to an end when I retired from work and went off to Cyprus to live. I finished with what I consider was probably our greatest achievement when we won the FA Vase at Wembley.

That day itself was the very emotional, it has to be said that the journey to the final was definitely a roller coaster of emotions, with many nerves being strained and many a tear of joy being shed. To be honest with the teams we have had we should have won the Vase much earlier but, boy, was it worth the



wait. A good night was had by all after the final and I just had to make sure I didn't get on the bus back to Dunston the following morninginstead of a flight to Cyprus. I don't think that would have gone down too well.

What a way to go out but it will come as no surprise that I did keep in touch from afar and always kept up with results and performances, so on my return 5 years later, I rejoined the committee, but it wasn't to last long because of various circumstances, I had to give it up again.

In truth I was just unable to commit the time that it deserves, and my pride wouldn't allow me to just go through the

motions.

Although I man the barrier when the players enter the field and am an occasional ball boy, still with 100% record. I am now, essentially, just another supporter but it has been said rather a vocal one. Amongst other things I have been likened to a foghorn and I do come out with the occasional witticism from the sidelines, with my most notable one being about the refs pie getting burnt in the oven going viral on YouTube (with subtitles) during our Vase run.to be fair I have been called many things in return but it is all part of the fun of it.

I am pleased to have met some wonderful people down the years both on and off the field and have made many a friend for life. I am proud to be connected to this wonderful club and will support it as long as I am able to and hope to see many, many more great players and great teams out on the hallowed turf.

The squad we have now can hopefully be the next one to win something. Here's hoping, So where do I start was easy but when will it finish,,,,, who knows. Your guess is as good as mine."



Dan played football from an early age and joined Hull City AFC when he was 10, earning a professional contract aged 18. Loughborough University followed where he completed a degree in Accounting and Financial Management while playing non-league football. He was an athlete who enjoyed the gym and took his health and nutrition very seriously. He lived life to the full and had so much ahead of him.

Other than feeling light-headed on a few occasions in the month before he died, he had no symptoms!

SUDDEN CARDIAC DEATH IN THE YOUNG (SCD)

- SCD is the leading cause of death in young athletes during sport and the majority of deaths occur with NO SYMPTOMS or family history.
- ARVC can be found in one in every 1,000 to 5,000 young adults - IF IT IS LOOKED FOR.




