Dunston Football Club History

The club first saw the light of day in 1975 as a humble works outfit when former Chairman, John Thompson, with some of his colleagues at HMSO on the Team Valley Trading Estate, decided to form a football team. The club joined the Newcastle City Amateur League playing at the Civil Service Sports Ground, Longbenton.

Early success inspired the club to progress and a piece of land was leased from Gateshead M.B.C. and the committee began to develop what is now the UTS Stadium.

The club were now gaining much success in the Northern Combination and with aspirations to progress further they approached the Federation Brewery to become the club's main sponsor. With the Federation Brewery as their main sponsor the club joined the Wearside League in 1987 and after another period of success the club felt a need to seek new opportunities and an application was made to join the prestigious Northern League. The club had now realised one of its main ambitions and entered the National Pyramid of Non-League Football. In its second season in the Northern League the club won the Second Division and was promoted to the First Division.

Since joining the Northern League the club has won the Second Division, been First Division Champions twice, League Cup winners on five occasions and JR Cleator Cup winners on five occasions. Included in these successes were back to back First Division title winners and League Cup winners in seasons 2003/2004 and 2004/2005. A magnificent achievement.

Season 2007/2008 had seen the club lose the word Brewery from its name as sadly it lost the main sponsor. After a period of 18 years of continuous sponsorship the Federation Brewery was taken over by Scottish and Newcastle Breweries who continued to sponsor the club for a further two seasons and after a period of twenty years the club had lost its main sponsor and had no association with a brewery. In our hour of need two new companies became involved with the club to partially compensate for the loss of our main sponsor.

Dunston Van and Truck Centre became our home shirt sponsor and Astley Signs became our away shirt sponsor. Both companies are still with us at the present time. Season 2008/2009 a company, UTS Engineering (Utility Technology Services), became involved by sponsoring the player's travel and training kit and during the close season of 2009/2010 they kindly agreed to become the club's principal sponsor. The club name was changed from Dunston Federation F.C. to Dunston UTS F.C., the name of the ground was changed to the UTS Stadium and company owner, Mr. Shaun Sadler became Club President.

On the 2nd April 2016 Dunston UTS celebrated their 1000th Northern League game. Prior to kick off on behalf of the club Malcolm James received an engraved plate from Northern League President George Courtney.

Building on the new-found momentum, Dunston continued in the same vein in the following season with a great run in the FA Cup, going out in the final Qualifying Round to National League neighbours Gateshead in front of a record crowd of 2,525 at the UTS Stadium.

The Club finished the 2018/2019 season as convincing Champions of the Northern League First Division, seventeen points ahead of their nearest rivals. Promotion ensued to the Northern Premier N/West Division but FA Regulations dictated that the Club Playing Name must not include any reference to a sponsor so the "UTS" was reluctantly dropped from the Club title before the new season.

Over the years the club has always recognised that success on the field must be coupled with success and hard work off the field and the efforts of the people behind the scenes at the UTS Stadium has ensured that the stadium is a credit to the club. Many of the committee of the club have been involved since it was founded in 1975, some as former players and some as management on the playing side.

It is a tribute to their commitment and hard work that the club has become one of the most successful in the North East.

In this week's player interview we talk to midfield dynamo Jake Stafford



With Dunston currently top of the Pitching-In Northern Premier League N/West Division, what are your thoughts on the season so far?

It's a great start to the season been top of the league is always a good feeling so hopefully we can come this run going.

Looking back on last season, and comparing it to how the team have started this season, it appears that you've learned how to cope with this league.

I think last season we wouldn't have got through the last two games like we have done. It's great to see that all of us have each other's backs and are sticking together, if we keep doing that we will be in around the top and fighting for the league title.

Swaz has added experience and quality to the team this season. Looking at the midfield, you've got 8 or 9 players who could play in the middle. Does that put pressure on you or push you on to perform better this season?

The signings he has brought in has helped us out loads this season. It's a bit or both if I'm honest, everyone wants to play, no one wants to sit on the bench, so when you get your chance you have to take it but I think it's good healthy competition because we all get on well.



You look back on the last two games, coming back twice to win, then add to that the fact you've had to play two games in the space of 3 days with a day's work chucked into the mix. The spirit and belief in the dressing room looks to be superb this season.

Yeah, we haven't made it easy for ourselves. We could close the game out a lot earlier with the chances we have created but it's good to see that we don't give up until the end. It's not easy going to work then a long trip on a Monday night but we know that at the start of the season and when you're playing well it makes the trip so much better when you come back with 3 points, The craic in the changing rooms is great, everyone is on a high so the more we keep that going the better for us I think.



Looking ahead to this weekend, a break from the league sees Dunston face Clitheroe in the F.A. Trophy. Based on their form at the moment they might prove to be one of the toughest sides you've faced so far this season. What are your thoughts on the game?

It will be a very hard game. Like ourselves they have started well, so we will have to be ready from the get go and hopefully we can make the club a bit of money in this competition. I think our main focus is the League but we will do our best to win every game that we have to play this season and it would be nice to get some money back in to the club

19th October 1996 - Northern League Division One
Dunston FBFC v South Shields

"Five star show-but this time it was the Fed who suffered"

Gary McDonald hit the goals trail once more. But it wasn't enough to prevent the home side from crashing to a 5-3 shocking defeat. McDonald hit a hat-trick to bolster his sides chance's but was let down by some poor defending which saw Shields move to within on point of the their hosts.

In fact the Dunston striker, who has set the goal scoring records on fire, wasn't the only player to hit a hat-trick with Nicky Gray, also helping himself to a treble to sink the Fed.

Shields went ahead after only four minutes when Gray, recently signed from Bedlington Terriers found himself completely unmarked to head home Mickey English's corner. Although Dunston had most of the game, South Shields increased their lead with almost an identical goal, this time Tim Wilson, heading home Thompson's cross.

Cockburn, McDonald and Robson all came close for the Fed but the Mariners went three up after 40mins when a slip by Boyle allowed Gray to fire home his second.

Dunston pulled one back just before the interval when McDonald bravely headed home. But any hopes that this would be the boost Dunston need would soon be dashed.

The Fed went further behind when Thompson's shot was wickedly deflected past a bemused Wolfe in the home goal.

Shields made it five when Gray complted his hat-trick after some more slack defending gave him the easiest of chances.

With three minutes to go, Gary Mcdonald chased a long ball through the middle to pull one back.

And the same player notched his third in the dying seconds witht he help of a deflection to give the score some respectability.



In the second half, Heslop was the first to unleash an effort at goal, with Dunston breaking, Stafford and Kanda having harassed Tadcaster off the ball to set Heslop away, his shot went wide and high of the target.

Match report Brighouse Town vs Dunston UTS FC

Dunston make it 2 wins in the space of 2 days following a captivating 4-3 win away to Brighouse Town.

The League leaders have won 3 games from 3 on their travels to Yorkshire but Chris Swailes was under no illusion of how tough the game would be heading into this fixture.

The hosts got off to the a fine start and lead after 2 minutes through James Hurley, a free kick whipped over Connell and headed back into danger ended with Hurtle powering in his effort into the net.

Connell made up for his mistake 4 minutes later, his delivery up-field collected by Connor

Bell who was upended in the box by Brighouse keeper George Clarke. Up stepped Terry Galbraith who made no mistake from the spot with a calmly taken spot kick, the experienced defender taking his tally to 3 goals for the season so far.

Stand in skipper Michael Hall gave Dunston the lead 5 minutes later, Galbraith with a dangerously whipped in free kick, picking out the goal scoring prowess of Hall.

Galbraith further extended Dunston's lead on 39, a scuffed corner in the box, an ensuing scramble, saw Tez finish as the away side went into half time leading 3-1.

The opening 20 minutes of the second half went by with little of note, say for Scrapy rattling the cross bar with a ferocious strike. The introduction of Laurence Sorhaindo on the 63rd minute seemed to change the home side's fortunes.

On the 72nd minute Alhassne Keita glided past two blue shirts down the left hand side to smash in his effort at the near post and get Brighouse back in the game. 2 minutes later the home side levelled the score; following some impressive play on the edge of the box, a Kurt Harris lay off saw Sorhaindo adjust his body goal wards and smash the ball into the back of the net from the edge of the box.

Dunston had looked nervy during a fine spell from Brighouse. However, just like the game on the weekend, where Dunston had surrendered a lead, they were not finished as Connor Bell, on his full league debut, ensured all 3 points on 80 minutes with his first goal for the club, finishing from close range as Scott Heslop marauded down the wing to send in a sumptuous delivery.

In a game of excitement, nerves and entertainment, playing twice in the space of 3 days is a big ask for even professional players. So after a solitary days rest, a full day at work and a two hour journey on a coach, having to endure the monotony of the A1, to come away with 3 points on a wet Monday night in Yorkshire speaks volumes for the tenacity, belief, work rate and attitude of Chris Swailes and his players.





Clitheroe FC history September 2020

The club was formed as Clitheroe Central in 1877 at the Swan Hotel in Castle Street by local businessmen. After playing in local leagues, the club joined the Lancashire Combination in 1903 and dropped Central from their name. Aside from breaks during the First and Second World Wars, the club continued to play in the Combination until the end of the 1981-82 season, when it combined with the Cheshire League to become the North West Counties League.

For the first 100 years of Clitheroe FC's existence, a Lancashire Junior Cup win in 1893, the Lancashire Combination Cup in 1934-5 and the League Championship in 1979-80 all that the club had to show for its efforts. That was soon to change. Although Clitheroe were put into the Third Division of the NWCFL at its inception due to the state of the ground, there followed the most successful period in the club's long history under the stewardship of Eric Whalley, subsequently manager and Chairman of Accrington Stanley FC. He assembled one of the best non-league sides in the North of England and won back to back Championships in the Third, Second and First divisions, as well as securing the Lancashire Cup for the first time in 50 years, thanks to a solitary strike from local lad Eric Geldard. This was all the more impressive when one considers that the Division 1 was effectively Level 3 in the non-league pyramid.

Captained by Mick Ashcroft and containing extravagant talents such as John Taylor and Steve Mullen, possibly the best player ever to play for the Blues, Clitheroe regularly attracted bumper gates, with the championship winning season seeing three crowds over 1,000. Cracks started to appear when Whalley took over the manager's seat at Accrington. To compound matters, the new Northern Premier Division 1 was formed, but a lack of floodlights meant the Blues could not take their rightful place and they found teams effectively leapfrogging them.

It was not until the mid nineties that the Club recovered from this setback and started to fulfil its potential. It became a force in the NWCFL Division 1 again and also made itself known on the national FA Vase stage. Having been pipped to the title in 1994-95 by Bradford PA in controversial circumstances, the following season saw possibly the highlight of the club's history when the Blues reached the Vase Final under the joint managership of Dennis Underwood and Gary Butcher after an epic two legged semi Final win against Mangotsfield United of Bristol. 2,000 people were on Shawbridge for the second leg when a deflected goal saw the Blues home with seven minutes of extra time remaining. The Final pitted the Blues against a powerful Brigg side and a 3-0 reverse in front of 7,500 fans was a fair reflection of the play. In the close season, Clitheroe also received their record transfer fee, £45,000, from Crystal Palace for goalkeeper Carlo Nash.

The Wembley experience turned the Blues into a Vase side and a Quarter Final defeat against Tiverton in 1998/99 and a two leg reverse against Taunton in the 2000/01 semi-final gave the Blues national prominence. The Taunton season saw Clitheroe beat pre-tournament favourites Chippenham in the quarter final on their own patch before a two-legged semi against Taunton Town, which would never be forgotten. With the first leg away and the game only just surviving an absolute deluge, the Blues went in at half time 5-0 down and reduced to 10 men. There was not much good humour amongst the 150 travelling Blues over that cup of Bovril. No further goals followed, but with manager Dave Burgess throwing caution to the wind in the home second leg, the fans dared to dream with 3 goals for the home side in the first 15 minutes (including hitting the post) and the Taunton keeper being stretchered off, but in the end Clitheroe went down 8-4 on aggregate.

Dave Burgess stood down at the end of the season and central defender Lee Sculpher took over as player manager. In 2002/3, Clitheroe again finished as league runners up and lost to Mossley at Gigg Lane in the League Cup Final. Early cup exits the following season enabled the Blues to concentrate on the league and superb away form saw the Blues capture the 2003/04 league title on the final day of the season at Nantwich where Blues legend Neil Reynolds sparked bedlam when he thumped a 25 yarder into the top corner with six minutes of the season remaining.

High hopes accompanied Clitheroe's first foray into the Unibond League in 2004/05, but the club never fully recovered from manager Lee Sculpher resigning after a handful of games into the new season. He was succeeded by Paul Byrom who then quit in the close season. Tommy Lawson was appointed manager for the 2005/06 season but he was relieved of his duties in early 2006, to be replaced on a temporary basis by Mark Smitheringale. He too left before the 2006/07 season started and his assistant Chris Stammers stepped up to the plate before resigning after a 10-1 thumping away to Conference North Kettering in the FA Trophy in November 2006. The then chairman Carl Garner offered the job to Neil Reynolds and Pete Smith at the turn of 2007, before the latter took on the role in his own right at the end of the 2008/09 season. 2009/10 and 2010/11 saw Clitheroe finishing in eighth and sixth respectively, the highest league placings in the club's history. The end of the 10/11 season also had a unique twist with Carl Garner stepping down as chairman after four years to replace Pete Smith as manager, in the process going unbeaten throughout April and taking the manager of the month prize. Garner was replaced in the role of chair by his long-standing deputy Anne Barker.

Despite the great end to the previous campaign, the 2011/12 season under Garner's leadership was ultimately disappointing, although it had started so brightly with another manager of the month award. Form quickly tailed off and huge player turnover ensued, before Garner resigned and the managerial Vase duo of Burgess and Sculpher ensured survival on a temporary basis, having taken over with less than 10 games to go. Paul Moore, the ex Leek Town and Warrington Town manager, took over the reins in 2012/13 and led Clitheroe to their record points total in Division 1 in finishing eighth, with the play-off push only ending over the final games of the season. However, the loss of key players in the close season led to a woeful start in 2013/14 and to an early exit from the FA Cup and Trophy, and the committee replaced Moore mid-season with ex Blue Simon Garner.

Garner steadied the ship and Clitheroe finished the season in 17th position, with Garner setting his stall out in 2014-15 to create a more east Lancashire focussed team. A 13th place finish and an appearance at the Reebok in the Lancashire Trophy against Chorley represented good progress, whilst the 7th place in 2015-16 continued the good work, and the push for the play-offs only faltered in the final weeks. Following Garner's resignation, the club moved quickly to appoint ex Wales international Simon Haworth to the manager's role. He moulded a team from scratch into genuine play off contenders, only faltering in the penultimate game of the season to a 90th minute goal at rivals Colne. 2017-18 could not quite recapture these heights although both Kurt Willoughby and Alex Newby featured prominently in the league goal-scoring charts. When Howarth announced he was leaving, the club appointed former Warrington Town manager, Stuart Mellish. After an unhappy, short tenure, his assistant, former Ossett Town manager Lee Ashforth was handed the role six games into the season. Unfortunately, Clitheroe endured their worst season at this level and Ashforth's tenure was brought to an end. Former Lancaster manager Phil Brown steadied the ship in the truncated 2019-20 season, with crowds averaging back over 350 and the Blues hovering around the play off places. He left for personal reasons at the end of the season and the club appointed former Blue David Lynch as player manager for the 2020-21 season.

Off the pitch, local businessman Stewart Fort took over the chairmanship of the club from Lee Sharples in the close season and has already started to deliver his clear vision for the Shawbridge stadium, with an enhanced Board of Directors and with promotion to the next level very much in his sights. This builds on the work of long-standing Chair and current Director Anne Barker, who oversaw the incorporation of the club as a limited company, the renewal of the ground lease and the replacement of the clubhouse, changing rooms, toilet block and electricity/medical room during her tenure at a cost of over £150K.

David Lynch: 27 year old player manager. A combative midfielder, who numbers Halifax Town, Southport and Alfreton amongst his former clubs, as well as playing early in his career for the Blues. Taking his first steps on the managerial ladder.

Chris Holland: Assistant manager. Played in the Premier League for Newcastle United and made 279 appearances in the Football League for Preston, Birmingham, Huddersfield and Boston United.

Louis Mayers: Coach. Made his debut for Clitheroe as a 17 year old centre forward. Has now forged a career for himself as a personal trainer and gym owner.

Neil Coomber: Physio in his second full season at the club. Part of the Myerscough College sport setup.

Chris Thompson: 30 year old stopper, with over 100 Clitheroe appearances to his name. Firm fans' favourite and a member of the Team of the Decade.

Markell Foulds: 19 year old defender in his second year at the club. Formerly on Burnley and FCUM's books, he is now focussed on developing as the club's first choice right back.

Cole Lonsdale: Tenacious 23 year old left back, formerly on Bolton's books, back for his second spell at the club. Loves to burst down the line, and links up well with the front line, using his sweet left foot to full advantage.

Chris Smalley: 100+ Clitheroe appearances to his name before he became a mainstay at Stockport County and then playing for Stalybridge Celtic last season. The 30 year old is now back to lend his experience and support to Clitheroe's promotion push.

Jimmy Mutton: Highly regarded 26 year old central defender, signed from Sutton Coldfield after recently moving to the area.

Ollie Muir: First coming to the Blues as a loan signing from Lancaster City two years ago, the 20 year old played the bulk of last season across the Back 4. Now looking to secure a regular berth for himself.

Billy Priestley: Centre Back. Started his career at Ramsbottom where he won the league before he followed Messrs Johnson and Morley to Salford, where he stayed for three years. He has since played for Southport and Bradford PA, and will relish the skipper's arm band at Shawbridge.

Ross Dent – Midfielder. A Clitheroe lad. Still only 25, he already has 150+ Clitheroe appearances to his name and another member of the Team of the Decade. Having spent the last two seasons with former manager Simon Haworth at Stalybridge, Ross cemented his reputation as one of the hardest working and most fearless midfielders around.

Oscar O' Neill: Young midfielder previously on Preston's books, signed last year from Lancaster City. Has all the attributes and will be looking to secure a place in the engine room from the off.

Gary Stopforth: Previously on Blackburn's books, he first cut his teeth in non league at Clitheroe over 10 years ago. Danny Pilkington – Has played football in the football league for Stockport County, and Conference football for York, Kidderminster, Hereford and Barrow. An attacking forward, he is looking to get back his sharpness and to terrorise defences again.

Connor Gaul: Noodle is already a league winner at this level with Atherton Collieries, and he quickly became a fan's favourite with his mercurial wing play and goal scoring record for the Blues. Will be looking to replicate that form this season.

Jake Connelly – 18 year old winger played for the England Colleges XI, suffering an injury just as he was starting to make inroads into the first team. Has filled out over the summer and will be looking to use his power to terrorise defences.

Terry Cummings – 23 year old signed last season from Burscough. A big hit with the Shawbridge crowd, using his strength and pace to take on defences. Will be looking to add to his goal tally to complete the package.
